Apprenticeship Expo set for Panthers

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call, or come in for testing, you should definitely do so, because history tells us that many applicants just don't follow through" said Mr Palmer.

All the major Group Training Organisations who recruit, employ and train Apprentices and Trainees on behalf of employers in their group will be there, and are all worth applying to. Parents are encouraged to attend and to especially visit the Schools Industry Partnership stand for practical advice on how to support their teenagers career goals. For teenagers who are unsure about



their career or how to make a start there will be six professional Careers Advisers from the Nepean Careers Forum available for a brief chat and a few pointers. TAFE will be on hand to advise about other training options.
