Well done to all these competitors for their efforts in a tough competition.

The **Arndell Boys Basketball** team competed at the AICES Open Schools Basketball Championships at the Fred Caterson Basketball Stadium in Castle Hill last Thursday 31st May. The team had won their place at the Championships following an impressive performance at the Hills Zone Gala Day earlier in the year and were keen to prove themselves as a force to be reckoned with.

The boys had enjoyed a practice game at St Paul's Grammar School in the lead up to the Championships and had trained hard despite a few injury scares. In a demanding four game roster, the boys first faced Reddam House whose full court defence tested our ability to move the ball up court. After a difficult start the boys managed to push the ball forward and drew level at half time. The captain Ben Gibbons was instrumental scoring at will in the key, while Jake and Michael Prichatt teamed up to set up easy baskets. In the second half we let our guard down and saw Reddam streak to a 10 point lead. Unfortunately we were unable to claw our way back and lost 31-22. It was a similar situation in game two as The Illawarra Grammar School set the pace in the second half. Arndell made a demanding impact closing out the first half to be again tied on the siren, but TIGS dominated the last 10 minutes, winning 35-22. Keegan Zoomer and Matthew Andronicos were powerful in rebounding staking claim on any loose ball, and Joey Allerton's attack and defence from the point guard position kept the opponents on their toes. Game three against Pittwater was a nail biter as Arndell was hungry for a victory. A pattern was emerging with teams split by a single point at half time. Luke Van Opynen stepped up for us in penetrating the key while our taller players enjoyed a higher level of competition to what we were use to. In a last minute effort Pittwater drew ahead by 3 points and a buzz beater attempt from Joey Allerton could not secure a win for Arndell. In our final game, Arndell came up against St Philips who was looking threatening as the team to beat. Not to be down hearted after a tough few games, our boys took it to their zone defence and dictated the pace of the game. Matthew Grant and Michael Smith teamed up in delivering the ball up court while Ben McInnes enjoyed some freedom under the basket. Yet again it was square at the half and it was our consistency in the second half that let us down. In a 5 minute blitz, St Philips shot away to a commanding lead and we were unable to play catch up basketball. The final score 36-25 was not a true reflection of how close the game really was. I would like to thank the boys for their passion throughout the season, for their sportsmanship, and their parents for supporting Arndell basketball. This year has proven to be the start of a new era in Arndell basketball and next year is looking very promising for our boys. But it doesn't end there. A 3-on-3 competition will be held at lunch times during Term Three and an AAC team will be entered into the Windsor competition playing Wednesday nights to allow the boys to continue playing together.
