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From The Headmaster: Dr John Goddard

During this week on Tuesday night, I had the great pleasure of joining in our annual Thanksgiving Service. We had singers and musicians from both College and Community Church, a great address from Mr Greg Peisley and many other opportunities for giving thanks, especially over supper. It was a splendid evening.

During his address, Greg spoke of those who are aware of the invitation to heaven through Jesus (The Parable of the Wedding Feast in Matthew's gospel) but brush it off as unimportant. This message resonated with me in so many ways. After all, as a teacher I feel I am no mere imparter of facts or of processes: rather, I invite learners to share in expanding their ideas, their understanding, their very selves, by exploring an area that is of vital importance to me. Thus, education is not a mechanical business but a deeply personal one. When it is offered to students, they have to respond, one way or another; and, as in the parable, they sometimes respond with indifference, as though education can make no real difference to them. **But it can!**

We have seen how it makes a difference, and how students respond to its challenges, in many contexts:

- on the Year 6 Camp this week at Port Hacking,
- in the Talent Quest last Friday Night, especially the Junior half of it,
- in the huge numbers of medallions, certificates and awards given out at recent assemblies, both Junior and Senior.

We acknowledge the difference when we acknowledge students who give a great deal to the College. In this context, it gives me great pleasure to announce that Ellen Nichols and James Mitchelhill-Miller are to be our two College Captains for 2007 – 08, beginning in office at the start of Term 4. Both students have impressed us (as did many others!) with the way they responded to the challenge of the leadership program and are well placed to set an excellent example in their Year of Office. They have a hard act to follow!

And that leads me to Year 12, the outgoing, Valedictory class. Parents will already have invitations to the Year 12 Formal in November. They and any other interested parents and friends are warmly invited to the Year 12 Valedictory Service, to be held next Friday 28 September, 1.30pm (be seated in the Gym, please, by 1.15.) On this occasion we gather as a Senior School to thank and to commend the Year 12 group, their Captains and leaders, for anything up to 13 years of contribution to the life of the College. They have been a fine Year 12 and I hope as many of you as possible will join us to thank them and wish them well.

Let me return to the Thanksgiving Service of Tuesday night. Many verses of the bible were used, not surprisingly; and we began with one which sums up so much of our focus at Arndell:

"O Lord my God, I will give you Thanks for ever". (Psalm 30)

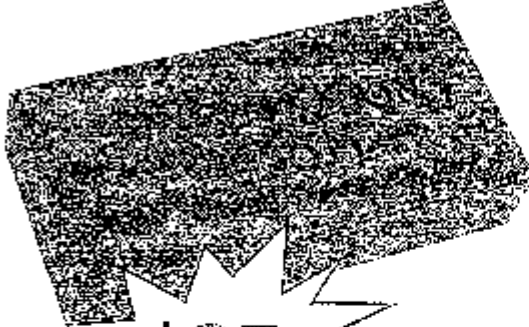
