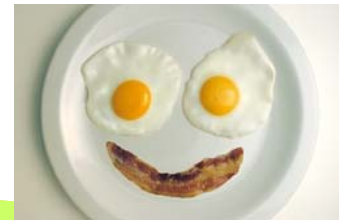

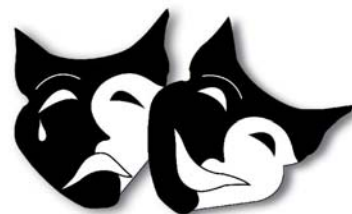

Uniform Shop News:

- Please note that the new uniform price list will come into effect from Monday 15th October 2007 and has been included in this weeks Advocate. There are many significant reductions to 16 uniform items, and only 2 price increases, so please update your price list if you have one at home (particularly if you send your child to the uniform shop with a cheque for payment of uniforms).
- The majority of the price reductions have been brought about due to new supplier arrangements, which have enabled us to reduce costs and maintain or improve garment quality. You may notice enhancements to some uniform items such as double stitching, reinforced buttonholes, extra length in shirts (to help keep them tucked in!) and school emblems added to more readily identify our uniform. Below is a summary of the changes to the uniform price list.
