Partying and School Formals:

- We are enthusiastic about the Year 10 and 12 Formals, because they provide a worthy finish to a significant stage of schooling in a friendly but appropriately formal manner - in the case of year 12, we are also very keen to have parents with us, as key parts of the event.
- ❖ We neither arrange nor endorse post-formal parties. In our experience, they start late and focus on the wrong things.
- Where after-parties are held, they are generally open to all and sundry. Please be aware that the provision of alcohol (no matter how you think it is supervised!) to under 18 year old people is an offence against the law
- Please be aware that Windsor Police have asked:
 - that they be given dates and times of school formals so that they can drop in; and
 - that we inform them of any after-parties we know about, so that they can discuss arrangements with those responsible for them.

The end of year Formal season should be a time of great enjoyment in an atmosphere of friendly civility. Please help us to make this so.

Students were enriched with work complementing their Science and HSIE units as well as learning how to apply de Bono's 6 Hats to their everyday thinking.

Year 3 students wrote and produced a video segment for tourism in the local area and were thrilled to be able to explore Windsor in the College bus for a day. Each student researched and ran commentary on a variety of tourist attractions and will receive a copy of their final DVD this term.

Year 4 explored different cultures using a variety of communication methods, which included the start of an electronic pen pals program with a school in Texas, USA. Year 6 decided to do the same with a school in France after they enjoyed planning a cultural holiday to Bali and scrap booking their experience.
