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# From The Headmaster: Dr John Goddard

What a splendid time it has been! We have had the Year 6 - Year 7 (2008) orientation, a day for students and an evening for parents, and both occasions were energetic and positive. I must commend the Arndell Year 6 students, who approached their orientation day in excellent spirit: they mixed with the newcomers, entered into the activities, asked good questions and gave a good account of themselves. They were a credit to the hard work of Mrs Sanderson and Mr Walker with them this year. So many of them had been in "Aladdin" only last week, and it was just marvellous to reflect on how well they could move between such different activities and show us such a range of skills.

Our own Year 7 and 8 students have been in exams this week, with Year 9's commencing on Friday and running into next week. Mrs Dean, and others supervising in the exam hall, have commented on how well the students have behaved and coped with the routine of exams. Of course exams don't tell you all you need to know about a student; but we take them seriously and have been very gratified to see students doing so too.

I have been delighted to hear of the exploits of Mitchell Waltho (Year 8) in the International Solar Boat Challenge. Mitchell has entered in the secondary schools division, as a one-man team; he has done all the design work and building and operating of his boat and has moved from the state competition to the Nationals, at Penrith Lakes this weekend. Only nine competitors/teams made it to Nationals and of some 40 NSW entrants, and this is a very fine achievement by Mitchell. We congratulate him most warmly and look forward to hearing how he goes at National level.

At a time of exams, a time when we tend (too easily?) to think in terms of marks instead of broader forms of measurement, it may be valuable to reflect on the deep meaning of the following verses:

Wisdom is supreme: therefore get wisdom. . . . I guide you in the way of wisdom and lead you along straight paths . . . Hold on to instruction, do not let it go; guard it well, for it is your life. The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.
