Welcome to 2008

We have students new in every year in the school, including two in Year 12, and we trust that, whether students are joining us for one year or for thirteen, they will have a fulfilling and a stimulating and a satisfying time with us in every respect. And to all parents and carers, a very big welcome to you; my wish is that you will all want to be a part of the Arndell adventure on which your children are embarked, by joining in parents' activities and by being at events in which the students take part: please join with us because, after all, you are giving us the great privilege of joining with you in providing the best in education for your children.

The holiday work this year has not been in terms of a new building to use but in terms of technology: a huge roll out of hardware, including the placement of 16 Smartboards throughout the school. May I thank most particularly Mr. Rohan Smith and Mr. Nathan Mares, who have spent countless holiday hours with the installation of all our new equipment; they provide a most remarkable service to the College.

We have a few changes in the Junior School as far as staffing goes, with Mrs. Miller moving into the library as the Junior School Librarian. Mrs. Chan is now the Stage Two Co-ordinator and teaching Year Three and we welcome a new Kindergarten teacher, Miss. Cooney.

We have also made some changes to the Welfare/Discipline Policy. The changes are designed to make our playground areas safer and happier places for everyone. Class teachers have already gone through these changes with the students. The modified policy will soon be made available to parents.

I would like to mention the importance of clear and regular communication between the College and the home. If at any time, you have concerns regarding your child, then please do not hesitate to discuss them with your child's class teacher, the stage co-ordinator or with me. Your child's class teacher should always be the first port of call. Messages or comments by teachers and parents can be written in the College diary in the Primary classes, while Infants classes use the "Boomerang Book" system.

For all the parents who are new to the College and as a reminder to those less new, all_Junior School students who are travelling home by car must be collected from their classrooms. Children who catch buses and those who know they are to go to after school care, go immediately to their respective areas. Children who have not been collected from the classroom before 3:30 pm are sent to after school care. (A fee will be payable if this is the case.) Do not, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES ask your Junior School child to wait for you in the turning circle, carpark, bus bay or any other area other than their classroom. Following these rules is of the utmost importance if we are to avoid a tragic accident in the carpark and turning circle areas.

Textbooks have already been distributed to students in Kindergarten to Year Six. If there have been any complications regarding textbooks, please let me know as soon as possible.

Dear Parents,

May I begin 2008 by extending a very warm welcome to you all, whether it is back to Arndell or as newcomers, joining us with an enrolled student for the first time. I trust that the year will be a thoroughly fulfilling one for you; for my part, I look forward to sharing in the education, the developing and growing of your children.

I want to take this early opportunity to address several matters.

HSC Results, 2007:

In this area, matters continue to strengthen, and we build on the growth of recent years. We were delighted to see that Matthew Stojanovic, Dux of the College, earned a UAI of 98.70, the highest so far by an Arndell student; three more students scored above 90 (more than ever before) and six more again above 80 (more than ever before.) So the trend was excellent to see: strong results across many subject areas and further evidence that when students work solidly, and work closely with their teachers, they will do well at our school. I extend my congratulations to the HSC class of 2007, their teachers and parents, on a job well done!

Getting in Touch with your School:

It became clear to me, during the course of 2007, that I needed to be more explicit about making contact with the right person in the best way. Sometimes, matters were brought to me on which I could only advise a discussion with a teacher or other staff member first. In 2008, we shall be asking of parents:

- Has the question/issue/concern been raised with and sorted out with the teacher or other members of staff to whom it is most immediately relevant? If, for example, the matter concerns work in an English class, discussion will start (in the Senior School) with the class teacher, then the Head of Department, and only then move on to more senior members of staff, if indeed that is necessary at all.
- Have all available steps been worked through? For example, if the issue were to concern a student's behaviour, then have disciplinary measures, monitoring measures, counseling measures, all been put in place and trialed?
- Has the matter gone to the right person? Sometimes, a parent will not be sure who this is (example: rules on Year 12 students and the driving of cars to and from school), and a preliminary call to our office staff can often clarify this and get you in touch with the right person first time around.

Issues raised at Presentation Night, 2007:

In my address at the Senior Presentation Night in December, I drew attention, amongst other things, to what I called Core Values: the values that underpin our teaching/learning programes, our pastoral and disciplinary structures, indeed everything that happens in the school. I argued that an absence of core values – a lot of action but a dearth of meaning, if you like - has been a problem for human societies reaching right back through the ages. It is not a new problem, though it seems to be a very obvious and prevalent problem in the world of the 21st century.

I based my comments on 1 Corinthians 13:13, which points us to faith, hope and love (the greatest of these three) and from them I branched out to valuing the centrality of:

compassion tolerance
empathy discipline
trust learning
commitment looking forward

achievement openness

humility.

Being fallible human beings, we won't get all these things right all the time, but we must at least aim to do so. And we will be well on the way to doing so if we focus very hard on *Love* and *Respect*, two important parts of the relationships that make up the society of the school. We must aim to love God, neighbours and self, always; and we must insist on respect, for each other, for the College's rules and structures, and for its Christian focus. Nothing less will do, and so insisting on *Love* and *Respect*, and all that is contained in these two brief words, will be clear in all our actions in 2008.
