

Academic Matters March 18th 2008

After a very smooth start, we are now settled well into the new academic year. As the assessment programmes for all years have commenced I thought it would be helpful if I explained some key elements of the College assessment policy.

Assessment Booklets

All students (Years 7-12) were issued with their assessment booklets within the first few weeks of this term. When these were issued to the students, every section was explained carefully and then students were given the opportunity to ask any questions they had - it is very important that students not only understand the College assessment policy but the consequences if they do not adhere to the rules. These booklets also include the assessment schedules for all subjects and courses for the year. Along with the booklet students were given a wall calendar/planner to plot their assessments on, for the year. Many students and their families find this wall planner a very useful organisational tool. At a glance students and their families can see when their examinations will be, as well as when their other assessments are due. If parents have not read their child's assessment booklet I strongly recommend you do - knowing how the assessment programme works can alleviate a great deal of anxiety for the whole family!

Assessment Tasks

- It is absolutely imperative that parents read the following sections in the Assessment Booklets headed Absent From or Illness During an Assessment Task, Malpractice During an Assessment Task and Rules Governing the Submission of Assessment Tasks. Heads of Department have reported to me that some students are going to receive a zero for their first assessment task as they have not complied with the College policy in the above areas.
- Students must have a **Doctor's Certificate** (not written by a family member) if they are absent from a task due to illness to certify that they were too ill to attend school.
- Time management. Students will now realise that more than one of their assessment tasks are often due around the same
- time. Consequently the managing of their time effectively is essential. By now all students should have established a study routine that suits them, but if your child is having difficulty managing their time, they are encouraged to seek help and advice from their subject and their Homeroom teachers.
- Class time allocated to the preparation of tasks. Many (but not all) assessments will have classroom time allocated to the
 preparation of assessment tasks. This allows teachers to check that students are managing their time appropriately and/or
 completing the task correctly. If class time has not been allocated, students are encouraged to bring their drafts to their
 subject teacher to ensure they are on the right track.
- Three tasks per week. Please note that students may be given more that three notifications of tasks in one week, but they should not have more than 3 tasks due in one week. It is possible that at one time students may have 6 or more tasks they are working on that will be due over a 4 6 week period. Although some students may find this initially overwhelming this work load is achievable if students manage their time wisely.
- Homework 2 weeks before a task is due. Students in Years 7-10 should not be given homework in the subject/course 2 weeks before an assessment is due in that subject/course unless it is related to the preparation of the task (eg drafts, completing sections of scaffolds, completing certain sections of the assessment to ensure they are managing their time wisely etc) Please note that students may have homework set in other subject/courses.
- Two weeks notification of a task. Students must be given at least two weeks notification of a task. If the task involves a significant amount of research students are often given more notice to accommodate this.

Year 12 Mid-Course examinations. Students were issued with their examination timetables on Friday 7th March. Not all courses have elected to have a mid-course examination this year so it is possible for the examination period to be completed in one week beginning Monday 31st March and ending Friday 4th April. Mrs Daley will also be asking students to fill out an examination attendance and traveling form.

Year 12 Board of Studies booklet and Wall Planner: On Friday students were also issued with a Board of Studies booklet *Rules and Procedures for 2008 Higher School Certificate candidates* and a HSC wall planner. Much of the information in this booklet is also included in the Assessment Booklet that students were issued with at the beginning of Term 4, 2007. It is important, however, that both students and parents read this booklet so they are aware of students' rights and responsibilities in regards to the HSC examinations.

University of Sydney HSC Enhancement Program. Throughout the year University of Sydney run HSC study days which are designed to build on students' HSC subject knowledge, help them to understand the syllabuses of the subjects they are studying and to give them advice on how they might achieve their personal best. These courses are run during the holidays by some of the leading teachers and lectures in the different courses. Students who have attended these courses in previous years have found them invaluable. Most lectures are 1 hour and 15 minutes and cost around \$29.00 each. A range of subject courses are usually run over one day so students can choose up to 5 lectures if they wish. The university also runs intensive 9 and 3 week courses in some subjects. Study packs are also available at a very reasonable cost \$16.25 - \$18.25 per pack. If students or parents are interested in this programme they can visit their website and online store on www.edassist.com.au OR make inquires through Miss Dunbar in the Mathematics department.



WORK EXPERIENCE 2008: Mrs Glenys Goddard - Careers Co-ordinator

Year 10, Year 11 and Year 12 students from Arndell are able to arrange Work Experience during any school holidays and be covered by Insurance.

Students benefit greatly by sampling an occupation of their choice, whether they go into that field when leaving school or not. Doing Work Experience can also have a beneficial effect for a student's Resume as it shows real commitment to voluntarily do Work Experience in the holidays, and the Employers feedback form can be useful for TAFE or getting a casual job.

To achieve this there is much paperwork that has to be signed by both the Employer and the Parent. Mrs Goddard spoke to all year 10 Students this week explaining how to go about arranging Work Experience. A letter to all Parents was also handed to each student at this meeting along with an initial Application form. It is suggested that all Year 10 students do Work Experience at least for a week in the June holidays. Please contact Glenys Goddard (Careers Adviser) if you have any further questions.

TAX FILE NUMBER.

Arndell students can obtain from Mrs Goddard a Student Application Form and Parent letter from the Taxation Department. Both forms need to be filled out and returned to Mrs Goddard who then signs the Application Form. Arndell sends this to the Taxation Department who then sends the student a Tax File No in the mail. The advantage to the student is that identification does not have to be provided as Arndell identifies you.

You will need a Tax File number if you wish to begin Casual Work. All Year 12 students should make sure they have obtained one through the school before they leave as it is also required for Commonwealth Supported places (HECS) at University.



Parenting Tips

What do we ask of Year 12 Parents?

- Please ensure your children attend School every term-day on time; we require a written, signed note of explanation for each absence;
- Please ensure they do homework and study EVERY night, at weekends and during vacations; a good steady approach all year, not last-minute cramming; please don't make excuses for them;
- Please monitor discreetly that they are getting enough sleep; mobile 'phones and msn! MySpace are often in use through the night making the following day classes problematic; pull the plugs if they won't;
- Keep them off all alcohol; it negatively affects cognitive function especially in developing brains; binges increase the risk of alcoholism. Attending parties and social events is one thing and fine in moderation, keeping them alcohol-free is another.
- Restrict major distractions like cars; they have managed so far without one; hold off to the end of the year, otherwise a lot of study-time may be wasted;
- Please let us know early if there are any worries or concerns which may affect the student's mood or well-being or performance at School;
- Please ensure they are playing sport and/or getting exercise; it is a very bad idea to give up sport at this stage. The exercised body and brain are much fitter, calmer and ready; with a healthy diet and good sleep, good study is more likely;
- Please ensure they are dressed and presented according to the school rules;
- There is time in each student's schedule for exercise, relaxation, a co-curricular activity, some community service; wise balance is important.
- Please remember the Colleges, some employers and other organisations view school and community involvement very highly for entrance selection, for scholarships and bursaries. A small amount of part-time work may be all right, but some students sacrifice a year or more of professional life (through neglect of study) to the excessive "need" for spending money now.
- Your children! Young adults need your leadership as much as ever; it is simply a more discreet mentoring and discussion-style leadership than that oaf few short years ago. Most of what is needed in Year 12is up to them, but they still need wise counsel and some boundaries. Please do not abrogate all leadership and decision-making support.
- Please read the School newsletter so you are well informed.

What do we ask of Year 12 students?

- Understand your responsibilities before your rights; if you have rights, then please ensure you have met your responsibilities.
- Excellent self-leadership.
- Leadership of your colleagues in Year 12 and of the School;
- There are no "frees" or "free periods"; you may have some study periods. .
- Invest in your future good study patterns, good exercise, sleeping and eating patterns;
- Enjoy the process; for most students Year 12 is tough, enjoyable and goes very fast! Laugh a lot. You learn much about yourself in the course of the Year.
- Set clear strong specific goals with the game plan to achieve them.
- Your team consists of you, your peers, your parents and your teachers.
- If you are fighting, squabbling or ducking away from any of them, it is your problem and you need to address it. If you are worried about things, confide in someone. If they are affecting your schoolwork, we are happy to try to assist. Look out for your peers' well-being and let us know if anyone needs help.
