# From the Youth Liaison Officer: Windsor Police Station

Bicycles/Scooters/motorised mini bikes and scooters.

All riders of bicycles must wear a helmet with the appropriate Australian Standards safety standard sticker attached. Fine \$53.

Anyone who rides a scooter/skateboard or roller blades should wear a helmet and protective gear.

The following vehicles (irrespective of the power output of the motor) are banned from use on roads or in public areas.

- 1. Motorised foot scooters (with or without a seat) electric/petrol engine
- 2. Mini-bikes
- 3. Motorised Human transporters such as the WheelMan, or SEGWAY
- 4. Motorised skateboards electric/petrol engines

### POLICE CAN SEIZE AND TAKE POSSESSION OF UNREGISTERED VEHICLES

(including prohibited vehicles)

If any of the above prohibited vehicles are used on a road or in a public place the following fines may apply:

Use Unregistered Vehicle \$477

Use Uninsured Vehicle \$477

Not pay road tax \$477

Total fine: \$1,431.

### WORK EXPERIENCE 2008: Mrs Glenys Goddard - Careers Co-ordinator

Year 10, Year 11 and Year 12 students from Arndell are able to arrange Work Experience during any school holidays and be covered by Insurance.

Students benefit greatly by sampling an occupation of their choice, whether they go into that field when leaving school or not.

Doing Work Experience can also have a beneficial effect on a student's Resume as it shows real commitment to voluntarily do Work Experience in the holidays, and the Employers feedback form can be useful for TAFE or getting a casual job.

To achieve this there is much paperwork that has to be signed by both the Employer and the Parent.

Mrs Goddard spoke to all year 10 Students this week explaining how to go about arranging Work Experience.

A letter to all Parents was also handed to each student at this meeting along with an initial Application form.

It is suggested that all Year 10 students do Work Experience at least for a week in the June holidays.

### TAX FILE NUMBER.

Arndell students can obtain from Mrs Goddard a Student Application Form and Parent letter from the Taxation Department. Both forms need to be filled out and returned to Mrs Goddard who then signs the Application Form. Arndell sends this to the Taxation Department who then sends the student a Tax File No in the mail. The advantage to the student is that identification does not have to be provided as Arndell identifies you.

You will need a Tax File number if you wish to begin Casual Work. All Year 12 students should make sure they have obtained one through the school before they leave as it is also required for Commonwealth Supported places (HECS) at University.

### Lost Property:

A system operates in the College which, when operating smoothly ensures the prompt return of lost items to students. The task of returning lost items is made virtually impossible when items do not have student names clearly marked upon them. It is the responsibility of students and parents to ensure that every item students bring to school is clearly marked; in the High School with the students name and home room number, and in the Junior School with the student's name. Due to the exponentially increasing number of items appearing in Lost Property any item which is not clearly labelled will be deemed to belong to no one and will be returned to the Uniform Shop automatically for re-sale.
