To All Year 7 and Year 9 Parents and Students

National Assessment [NAPLAN] testing is on its way!

When: May 13th – 15th, Tuesday to Thursday, Week 3 Periods 1 & 2 are for National Assessment

Periods 3 – 6 are as normal – ALL students are to bring their usual books for these subjects.

Year 7 & Year 9- Write this information in your diaries NOW

You will need for each day;

- 1. HB or 2B pencil
- 2. One pencil sharpener
- One eraser
- 4. CALCULATOR
- 5. Recess and Lunch [as normal]

There will be an additional recess break each day between tests.

You will not need

- 1. Pens or biros, coloured pencils or white-out correction fluid for the testing period. You will need your writing implements and work books/text books when you return to normal lessons after Recess. Periods 3 to 6 are normal lessons.
- White-out correction fluid is never allowed at school.

The test is only to tell us what extra learning we need to cover. It tells us how much information you have retained or remembered from Primary School. The tests are also a measure of the skills you have developed in both literacy and numeracy throughout your schooling.

Do not worry about these tests. They are not hard, just time consuming. They are quite fun in parts *too*. You may want to read more at home so to improve your reading speed, and also to improve your comprehension or understanding of what you are reading.

If you have any questions, come and speak to me. Remember, if you don't ask for help we cannot help you. My office is next to D1.

Looking forward to having three great days of learning and fun.

Carbohydrates (Term 2, Week 1)

Carbohydrates contain carbon, hydrogen and oxygen forming units called "saccharide groups". Carbohydrates are classified according to the number of saccharide groups present. Monosaccharides have one saacharide unit, Disaccharides have two units and Polysaccharides have many units.

Monosaccharide: These are the simplest form of carbohydrates. All carbohydrates are eventually broken down to this before getting absorbed and

utilized. Glucose, fructose and galactose are important monosaccharides for human nutrition.

- Glucose (dextrose or grape sugar): Glucose is not as sweet as sucrose(household sugar). Glucose does not require digestion. Fruits may contain glucose.
- 2. Fructose (levulose or fruit sugar): It is present in honey, fruits or vegetables. The main source of fructose for human is Sucrose. Fructose does not require insulin to get into the cells and sometimes recommended in Diabetes.
- Galactose: Lactose breaks down into glucose and galactose. Lactose is also called as milk sugar.

Sorbitol- It is produced when fructose is broken into its alcohol. Sorbitol is present naturally in pears, apples, prunes, peaches and red seaweed. Sorbitol does not raise blood sugar levels and is also slowly absorbed along the intestine.

Mannitol- Reduction of fructose to alcohol produces mannitol as well as sorbitol. Mannitol is found in seaweed, onions, mushrooms and pumpkin.

Xylitol- It is present in small amounts in some fruits and vegetables. It has the same energy value and sweetness as sucrose and is sometimes used instead of sucrose in chewing gum.

Early Start for the 2008 "Sew - In"

Time is drawing near to commence sewing squares together to make wraps for 'Wrap with Love'

I have attached Instructions for knitting the square wraps, so if you start early your finished squares can be delivered to the Student Services at the College.



Follow the pattern

Instructions for square wraps: need to measure 10 inches x 10 inches (25cm x 25cm)

Knitted Squares

To knit a 10 inch x 10 inch square use size 8 (4mm) needles, 8 ply yarn, cast on 50-55 stitches and knit each row plain (i.e. garter stitch)

Note: Test your tension to measure 10 inches (25cm) Do not knit: one row plain, one row purl (i.e.: stocking stitch) as your square will curl up No knots: Start each ball of yarn at the beginning of a row and sew in ends. Do not cut ends off short, as your square will unravel. When starting or finishing a square, sew in all ends **Diagonal Squares** cast on 3 stitches. Row 1: K1, increase 1 in next stitch, knit to end of row. Repeat Row 1 until side edge measures 10 inches (25cm) next Row: K1, K2 together, knit to end of row. Repeat this row until 3 stitches remain, cast off
