From The Headmaster:

Dr. John Goddard

I want to speak this week about the nature and importance of tours to distance parts which the College is undertaking. I see these tours as offering some of the most significant and stimulating opportunities of all – opportunities to grow in our understanding and appreciation of the wider world, a world, as our students need to learn, that is a lot wider than the Hawkesbury.

1. **Annual Northern Territory Expedition:** this tour, now to be undertaken by our school "flying solo", allows about a dozen students the chance to move way beyond their comfort zone. The move into various indigenous communities, they see a way of life they know nothing of, they share their faith and, I am sure, grow in their faith, and they experience the joy of helping and sharing. They are challenged in profound ways. Mr. Sedorenko and his colleagues are providing a wonderful experience for these students.
2. **College Choir Tour to United Kingdom:** this tour, for which fundraising is proceeding apace, will allow around 20 students (plus staff) the chance to sing in some of the world's greatest venues (York Minister, Bath Abbey, Coventry Cathedral and so on,) to understand more of the great choral and worship traditions in Anglican Churches and to see amazing places (Stonehenge, the Walls of York etc.) Please support the fundraising as best you can: see insert box later in the Advocate.
3. **Cultural Discovery Tour to Italy and Greece:** our Head of English, Miss Doman, is leading this group who will discover many of the most glorious places and treasures of the Ancient World. Discover? – well, for them it will be a discovery, and they will all remember things they saw in Rome when other aspects of school life fade into the deep recesses of the mind.

I urge all parents to support these happenings and, perhaps, to consider whether their child can take part in these or similar adventures in the future: through them our students can grow in surprising and fascinating ways.

Congratulations to Arndell Community Church, which has celebrated its 8th Birthday. (Yes, I know Mr. Peisley looks older than that!) It is a great statement both of God's goodness to us and of the zeal and commitment of Greg and of many others that the Church continues to thrive, to think and to exert such a powerful influence in the life of the community. Praise God!

Life, Work and Knowledge – Anyone want a JOB



It is a wonderful thing to gain knowledge. Even a privilege in this day and age considering the majority of the world's populations has less chances of gaining any substantial education. From the year 2000 to 2005, it is estimated that the global primary education completion rate increased from 78% to 83%. From the years 1999 to 2004 it is estimated that the numbers of out-of-school children fell by 21 million. If it fell by 21 million and the attendance increased by only 5% - how many more millions are

still not being educated. It is well documented that the poorer one is the less chance of gaining an education and it is well known that education helps people live longer because it leads to healthier living.

Woolaning Homeland Christian College has advertised for two positions in their school. The first is a position for houseparents. That is, a couple who will live on the school campus, run one of the houses, and looking after the 12 students who board during school terms. The other position is for a Counsellor/Chaplain who will be involved in helping students with various issues and running weekly Church Services on Sunday. Both these positions would give someone the opportunity to educate and help those indigenous students in their care. 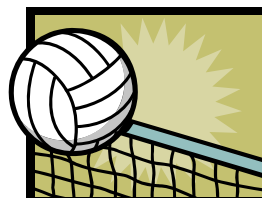
Lost Property:

WRAP WITH LOVE:

Time is drawing near to commence sewing squares together to make wraps for 'Wrap with Love'. If you start early your finished squares can be delivered to the Student Services at the College. For more information contact – Mrs Carol Wilson at the College

Follow the pattern

Instructions for square wraps: need to measure 10 inches x 10 inches (25cm x 25cm)

Knitted Squares

To knit a 10 inch x 10 inch square use size 8 (4mm) needles, 8 ply yarn, cast on 50-55 stitches and knit each row plain (i.e. garter stitch)

Note: Test your tension to measure 10 inches (25cm) Do not knit: one row plain, one row purl (i.e.: stocking stitch) as your square will curl up No knots: Start each ball of yarn at the beginning of a row and sew in ends. Do not cut ends off short, as your square will unravel. When starting or finishing a square, sew in all ends **Diagonal Squares** cast on 3 stitches. Row 1: K1, increase 1 in next stitch, knit to end of row. Repeat Row 1 until side edge measures 10 inches (25cm) next Row: K1, K2 together, knit to end of row. Repeat this row until 3 stitches remain, cast off.

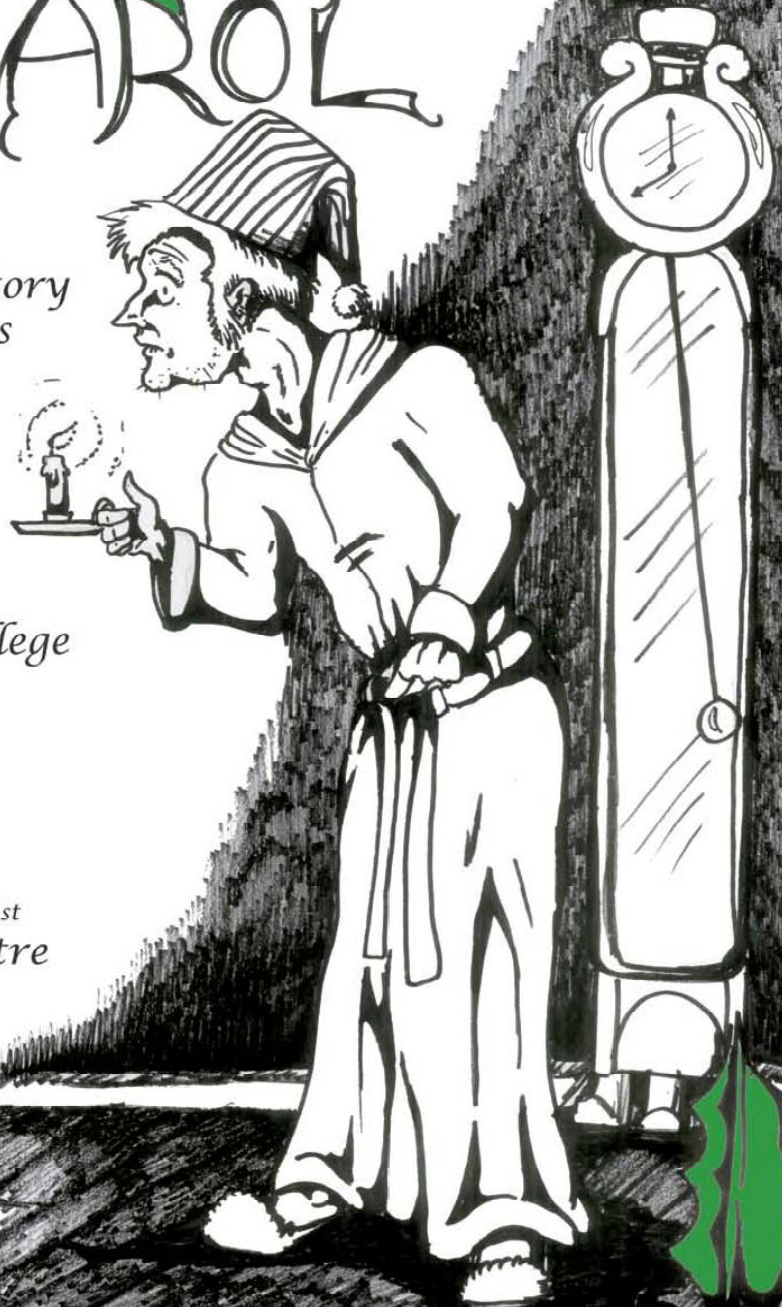
