From The Headmaster:

During last week, I had the opportunity to speak at an unusual assembly – unusual in that it was for Years 10 and 12 students only, all the other year groups being on camp. More about the camps later. The assembly was short and to the point:

- A reflection on Psalm 23, with encouragement that, whilst we all need shepherding, we should all look to provide shepherding to others, too.
- A most wonderful exhibition of juggling by Ryan Mills (Year 10): his face might have been a picture of concentration, but you should have seen the sheer delight on the faces of the audience at his skilful routine.
- Comments directed at the School Certificate and HSC students as they begin the run home to those vital exams.

Under that last heading I made two main points, which it would be good for parents to consider and to help their children put into practice. Firstly, although we all sprint as best we can when the time is close, it is the steady building along the way that is fundamental.

The point is particularly true of students working towards an HSC submission in a practical subject, which all fall due in July/August. Parents, be ready for the final sprint: but encourage your students to build mostly, and to sprint only when absolutely necessary. Then we conserve energy and produce a better outcome.

My second point was a selfish one. Both for School Certificate and for HSC students, at the final assembly for each group, I have the great pleasure of shaking each student by the hand, presenting them with their School credentials and congratulating them on a job well done. Often parents are able to be present at these special assemblies. One thing we all want to feel at such a point is that the conclusion to a major phase of schooling has been an honourable one. Students particularly need to feel that they have completed their task in a worthy manner, to the best of their ability, with earnestness and respect for all their fellows and teachers. When that is so, we look each other in the eye at the assembly and acknowledge that the student deserves congratulating for something fine and honourable.

As you know, it began to rain last week after the driest May on record; and, as you also know, this was because Arndell went on camp! The conditions were plainly not ideal; Year 9 copped the worst of it, early in their camp, but students were able to sleep dry and to dry out wet clothes. (By the way, what possesses some students, especially given the weather forecast, to come on a camp with only the one pair of shoes and no waterproof jacket at all? If they forgot to think about such matters, did their parents forget likewise?) I want to commend **all** the staff who went on the four camps, because it was up to them to manage the camps on a 24 hours basis and they did it magnificently, so that most activities continued, substitutions were arranged as required, and all stayed dry and well. To the camping staff, it was a superb achievement, and so it was for the students too. Part of going on camp is being prepared for an "out of one's comfort zone" experience, and this was a valuable experience indeed. Students came to the party splendidly. They and the teachers all deserved the following long weekend: it could not have come at a better time!

I return to the reflections on Psalm 23. The kind of encouragement it gives us is invaluable: in simple daily matters, or when faced with "the valley of the shadow of death", we are all in good hands and, indeed, we lack nothing we need. With such a great shepherd, how could we **not** want to do our bit of shepherding, too, and look after all those around us? It is our vital way of responding to our Lord:

The Lord is my Shepherd: I shall not want.

Proteins (Term 2, Week 7)

The second nutrient in our study is Proteins. Remember the first one was Carbohydrates!

The word protein is derived from a greek word "protos" which means first. Protein is the basic framework of all organisms and is responsible for growth and repair. The building blocks of protein are called amino acids. Nitrogen is the main component of all amino acids. The other components include oxygen, carbon and hydrogen. Some proteins may also contain sulphur, phosphorus, iron, copper and zinc.

Protein formation requires nitrogen to be supplied in two ways: (1) from the intake of protein foods (2) from the breakdown of body proteins (endogenous).

It is estimated that for every 100g of protein that is broken down, 16g of nitrogen would be generated. A person is said to be in nitrogen equilibrium when the intake of nitrogen equals its excretion in the feaces, urine and perspiration.
