I have found it stimulating and sometimes disturbing. You can't read it without occasionally saying to yourself, "Was I as dumb as that?!"

The words of John, at the start of the Book of Revelation, could apply more widely than just to the prophecies in that remarkable book, couldn't they. Let us think on this, applied to all of God's word:

**Blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it.**

## *From The Head of the Junior School:*

It seems that there has been quite a few difficulties with lost uniform items of late. Firstly, there always seems to be significant numbers of uniform items in lost property without a legible name on them. Even if you have labelled your child's uniform, please check all items to see if the labelling needs to be renewed. Secondly, despite labelling, students sometimes just grab the nearest jacket or jumper and put it on. Please also check that the uniform that your child brings home is actually the one that belongs to them.

Despite the fact that the weather is quite cold, it seems that we have some cases of head lice in the Junior School. Please check your child's hair and treat them with the relevant product if a problem exists.

With the winter weather, come the usual coughs and colds and sometimes something a little nastier. Teachers are the victims of these maladies just as the children in their care are and so it is sometimes necessary for them to be replaced by casual teachers. As often happens at this time of year, the pool of casual teachers shrinks and it is sometimes difficult to get someone to cover all of the classes. <b>Knitting:</b>	Follow the pattern

**Instructions for square wraps:** need to measure 10 inches x 10 inches (25cm x 25cm)

### Knitted Squares

To knit a 10 inch x 10 inch square use size 8 (4mm) needles, 8 ply yarn, cast on 50-55 stitches and knit each row plain (i.e. garter stitch)

**Note:** Test your tension to measure 10 inches (25cm)

Do not knit: one row plain, one row purl (i.e.: stocking stitch) as your square will curl up

No knots: Start each ball of yarn at the beginning of a row and sew in ends. Do not cut ends off short, as your square will unravel. When starting or finishing a square, sew in all ends

### Diagonal Squares

Cast on 3 stitches.

Row 1: K1, increase 1 in next stitch, knit to end of row.

Repeat Row 1 until side edge measures 10 inches (25cm)

Next Row: K1, K2 together, knit to end of row. Repeat this row until 3 stitches remain, cast off

## *From: Sydney West Area Health Service:*

- Weight status of school-aged children in Sydney West Area Health Service.
- Arndell Anglican College has been asked to be involved in a survey with the Sydney West Area Health Service concerning the problem of children being overweight which has had lots of coverage in the media. To find out whether this is a problem for our local community, the Sydney West Area Health Service is measuring the height, weight and waist circumference of students in local schools. Students in Year 4 and 7 are invited to participate in this health check. In high schools the project is being undertaken simultaneously with the school based immunisation clinics. However, students can be measured even if they are not being immunised.
- Details have been sent home with students last week. Please support this important project by agreeing to let your child participate in it.
- **All consent forms must be signed and returned to the school by Monday 30 July 2007**, irrespective of whether or not your child is participating in the project. This is different from the immunisation program.
