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From The Headmaster:

Every so often, I see something that just works! I know I would see it every day if I could only be moving about the school all day – but let me tell you about one marvellous moment when what I saw was inspiring and uplifting.

I was just out and about and I walked past a Year 12 Maths class, an advanced group with Mr Thompson in charge. At first I saw one student come out to the whiteboard and add something to (as it looked to me!) a very complex problem. There was discussion about this new element, and then another student added some more, and there was quite an animated discussion about whether this would get us to the solution - and I had to move on. I witnessed shared, adventurous and enquiring learning, guietly but encouragingly directed. It was marvellous: and I know I see it every time I am out and about, no matter what the age group. They are excellent aspects of learning in our school - shared. adventurous and enquiring - and I see them at work in classes, on excursions, at choir practices and so on. We would do well to celebrate such qualities (and others) as positive examples of how fine the learning environment for our students can be. Let us use every opportunity to celebrate them, at school and abroad!

Now is the time for me to remind you that places in the two key entry years (Kindergarten and Year 7) are filling rapidly and that, if you need a place for a sibling in those years particularly, now is the time to act. It does not often happen, but it is most distressing to put a child of an existing family on a waiting list. Parents do occasionally need to come to the school to talk over something they have found distressing. Don't keep it to yourself – come and tell us, so that the matter may be resolved. But may I ask that you come to "Old Admin" to arrange the discussion: that way it can be arranged both conveniently and discreetly. Student Services, with all that goes on there, is almost never the place to arrange the discussion. The best way in which we can get you promptly in touch with the right person is at "Old Admin", which you might think of as "Parents' Admin."

I look forward to seeing you at the many forthcoming events - Grandparents Day, the Music HSC Showcase, and others which you will find detailed in the Calendar section of this newsletter. Join in and be delighted and inspired, as I am daily; and, in your delight, give thanks to our Lord for the wonderful provision that is Arndell.
