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#### From The Headmaster: Dr John Goddard

Although this newsletter chronicles important happenings in the life of the school –

- Year 12 Music Showcase: well done to all, and may the exams next week work out really well:
- Year 8 off to camp next week are you all prepared?
- Extraordinary happenings for Mr Harrison's birthday if you don't know what we mean, ask your Junior School child!
- it also has the important function of raising issues, or raising awareness of issues, that affect all of us. We have done that with regard to bullying, to behaviour in cyber space, to discipline in the school, and to study techniques and attitudes.

So here's another one:

#### How does a parent best support their child at school?

Actually, it goes beyond "at school", but here are a few suggestions, from my reading, observation and personal experience.

- Support is support: it isn't taking charge and trying to solve your child's issues instantly, it's helping the child to find out how to do it.
- Support teaches strategies: such as planning strategies, getting on with people strategies, assertion strategies; and then strategies have to be put into action.
- Support empowers a child, because it focuses on getting him/her to think through issues, in a guided fashion.
- Support acknowledges that our children make mistakes, and that they will have to be helped to deal with the consequences. I sometimes hear, "I know my child's not prefect, but they would never lie to me". I feel that such a parent cannot offer support, because they cannot acknowledge that there is anything to support.
- Support is always there: we hang in there, even when rebuffed because we know that there will be a call on our support, and we must be ready at
- We support individuals and so as parents we understand the different needs of our various children and respond accordingly.

As a school, we need to follow the same principles, in the ways in which we support the children of Arndell. And support, like a parent's support, is tested in difficult times, but it is genuine support it will be practical, empowering, honest, ever-ready and individual. I trust that home and school will always work together in providing this true sport.

At a much more profound level, such support is what we receive when we turn to God in faith:

### Attention Arndell Equestrians

Due to the outbreak of Equine Influenza, the Arndell Equestrian Carnival scheduled for this Saturday 1st September, has been postponed. A new date is yet to be set, and we will inform you as soon possible. Riders, please be aware that the ban on the movement of horses in NSW which is currently in place, includes all movement of recreational horses. This means you may not transport any horse from your property; this includes trail riding around your area, or even taking him for a walk to eat grass



up the road. Heavy penalties apply, so please do not take your horse off your property until the ban is lifted. The media is widely covering this arrangement for race horses, but it does apply to **all** horses and ponies in NSW. If we comply with the ban, the quicker the outbreak is likely to be contained and the quicker we can get back to what we love doing - riding.
