This time of year is always extraordinarily busy, with all the things that need to be done all happening at once. Last year I included some comments regarding reports and I would like to include them again this year:



Alcohol

Sale or Supply of Alcohol to Minors - A person shall not, in any place whether or not licenced premises, sell or supply liquor to a person under the age of 18 years. Penalty \$500 fine. Liquor Act 1982, Section 114 (1).

Smoking

A police officer may seize a tobacco product or non-tobacco smoking product in the possession of a person in a public place if the officer suspects on reasonable grounds that the person is under the age of 18 years. IT'S NOT AN OFFENCE TO POSSESS SMOKES UNDER 18 BUT POLICE CAN CONFISCATE SMOKES FROM PERSONS UNDER 18. Public Health Act 1991, Section 58.

Fireworks

Legal Fireworks "toy firework" means amorce, <u>blaster ball</u>, <u>confetti bomb</u>, <u>bon-bon cracker</u>, <u>sparkler</u>, <u>streamer cone</u>, <u>toy pistol cap</u>, starting pistol cap and <u>indoor table bomb</u>. Explosive Regulation 2005, Clause 50. All other forms of Fireworks are illegal and if found in possession you require a licence to possess (Explosive Regulation 2005, Clause 25). "display firework" means a <u>firework</u> (other than a <u>distress signal</u> or a <u>toy firework</u>) consisting of a case or contrivance forming a squib, gerbe, cracker, serpent, mortar shell, lance, wheel, coloured fire, Roman candle or other article specially adapted for the production of a pyrotechnic effect or a sound effect. Offence for possess firework without a licence Penalty \$1,000, Explosives Act 2003, Section 6.

What is uniTEST and how can it help?

uniTEST, is a $2^{1/2}$ hour multiple choice aptitude test that will assess your generic reasoning and thinking skills. It doesn't matter what subjects you have studied as questions are based in the two broad areas of mathematics/science and arts/humanities/social sciences. All information you require to answer each question will be provided in the question stimulus.

Several universities have indicated an interest in the use of uniTEST to help identify students that don't meet the course required Tertiary Entrance Score, but who may have the potential to succeed at University.

IIRAP NR

The Learning Enrichment and Acceleration Program (LEAP) has been back in full swing for Year 7-10 and students have enjoyed a number of incursions that not only extended their learning base but rewarded their excellent grades.

The CSIRO visited the College and treated students to two very different presentations, the first of which was Forensic Frenzy. LEAP students in Years 9-10 played forensic scientists to examine the clues and evidence in a crime to find the culprit. Most discovered that the TV show CSI is a little beyond real-life forensics then Hollywood would have us believe. The second show was for Years 7-9 and looked at weird science experiments. Students used a strobe light to slow down vision and saw Mr Burroughs held up by four light globes. Must be that light diet he is on?

LEAP students have also witnessed first hand the beauty and diversity of Australian wildlife. Travel Bugs brought an interactive show to the College with lots of creepy crawlies for the students to touch or run away from...depending on scare levels. An Entomologist showed students the strange lifestyles of insects and showed just how HUGE stick insects can grow. Croc Stars then treated students with a different sort of wildlife show. What do you get when you add two lizards, a turtle, two snakes and a crocodile to a classroom? A half empty classroom!

The final LEAP incursion for the year was a crazy scientist from Fizzics Education who added the "WOW factor" with a flask of liquid nitrogen. All LEAP students from Years 3-10 witnessed a nitrogen steam engine, a frozen waterfall and ice bubbles. Students had the privilege of witnessing a rare superconductor make a magnet levitate in thin air. The interactive show was a great way to finish the year for Senior School LEAP.

Junior School LEAP students have been finishing off their projects for the year. Year 3 decorated and launched bottle rockets into the earth's atmosphere. Year 4 continued their interaction with students from Mitchell Intermediate School in Texas, USA. Year 5 scripted and filmed a movie set in outer space. Year 6 completed their Bali scrapbooks and continued their cultural correspondence with students from College Tonkin near Lyon, France.
