Robocup

On the 9th and 10th of September, fifteen Junior School students represented the college at the 2007 NSW Robocup Junior at the University of New South Wales.



In Robocup, teams must design and build their own unique robots and then program them to perform autonomously. They are also required to keep a journal to show the progression of their ideas. We had one team entered in the dance competition which is an integration of Science, Technology and the Arts. Participants program their robots to dance to music. Teams are encouraged to decorate their entries and to motorise robot limb movements, to give their robots real personality. In Junior Rescue, where we had 5 teams entered, robots compete by following a winding line on a series of tiles to a designated rescue area. On the way the robot could encounter obstacles and short cut opportunities that challenge the most intrepid programmer. After negotiating the randomly selected path, the robot arrives at a green coloured area which indicates a chemical spill. While the clock is still ticking the robot must find "the victim" before pushing them out of the quicksand to safety. This year the challenge was made significantly harder with the addition of bridges, dead ends and speed humps. Many

teams found the new course extremely made for an exciting competition with moments. All of our teams performed

proud of their results. Daniel Sinclair Year 6 and Hannah Robinson Year 5 made the finals place. This is the second year in a row that Arndell has had a team in 2nd place. 


An invitation to keen Year 8 students
