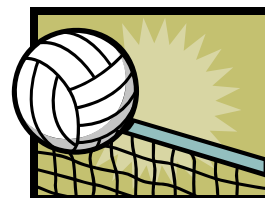

## *Adolescent School Based Vaccination Program 2008:*

Information was handed out to Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 female students only, early last week in regards to the Adolescent School Based Vaccination Program 2008.

In 2008 the NSW Health Dept will be offering the following vaccines:

- a three dose course of human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for female students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10.
- a two dose course of hepatitis B and one dose of varicella (chicken pox) vaccine for male and female students in Year 7.

*Resistant Starch: Roshini David Paul Accredited Practising Dietitian  
Member of the Dietitians Association of Australia*

Resistant starch is defined as the total amount of starch and the products of starch degradation that resists digestion in the small intestine of healthy people. (Euresta). Some starch resists the breakdown (digestion) in the small intestine and get fermented by bacteria in the large intestine. The end products of fermentation are the SCFA'S (Short Chain Fatty Acids). These consist primarily of butyrate, propionate, and acetate. These SCFA'S are much needed sources of energy for the colonocytes (cells lining the colon).

NHMRC has released the new nutrient reference values (NRV) and as per the guidelines the suggested Dietary Targets for dietary fibre:

- Men- 38 grams/day
- Women- 28 grams/day
- Teens- 20-30 grams/day

NHMRC'S Nutrient Reference Values report also considered the capacity for certain nutrients to actively reduce the risk of diseases when consumed at higher levels.

**Did you know?**

The first commercially available resistant starch was developed in Australia and was first generated in fibre-enriched white bread (wonder white) in 1994.

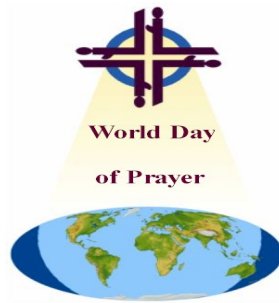

This years theme is "God's Wisdom Provides New Understanding" brought to you by

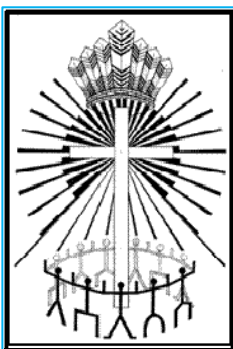
