Proteins (cont'd) (Term 2, Week 9)

Albumin: It is a protein that can be synthesized only in the liver. Therefore in chronic liver disease the serum albumin level is low. Albumin aids in the transport of certain products by binding with them eg. Bilirubin, cortisol and other hormones.

Globulin: Proteins that are produced by lymphocytes and plasma cells are known as *immunoglobulins*. There are five types of immunoglobulins: IgA, IgD, IgE, IgG and IgM.

Fibrinogen: It is the soluble precursor of the protein fibrin. Fibrin is responsible for the formation of the blood clot.

Fibronectin: This is the protein responsible for clearing certain substances such as cellular debris, fibrin microaggregates and denatured proteins.

LEAPing through 2008: Mr Steven Burroughs

This year so far has been a busy one for LEAP students in Years 5-10 who have had opportunities to participate in areas of learning outside the regular classroom. While Stage 3 students have been meeting on a weekly basis, senior students have been offered a range of incursions and workshops designed to enrich their educational experiences.

A select group of students in Years 5-6 have explored new information technologies available on the Internet and each have created a web log (blog) to showcase their work. Year 5 studied camouflage characteristics of insects before building a habitat to mimic the natural environment of wild animals



while Year 6 researched, designed and constructed environmentally-friendly houses. Both year groups then undertook a creative writing unit to publish stories online on their blogs.

LEAP students in the Senior School were treated with a number of workshops, excursions and competitions to extend on learning opportunities. To cater for different areas of interests, students participated in an Artist's Outlet to release the creative sides of students who are artistically talented. Those with gifts in computers and engineering were involved in a Robotics workshop where they programmed Lego robots, and students with a lean towards performing arts were given a place in a movement theatre workshop from the National Institute of Dramatic Arts. The top students from each year group competed in the first Arndell Academic Pentathlon where teams battled it out in various academic areas to determine which year group could claim to be the 'smartest' at Arndell. After a tough contest it was Year 8 who proved to have the edge over the other year groups, at least for now.



The Pentathlon served as a warm-up for 8 students from Year 10 who travelled to Knox Grammar School for the annual Da Vinci Academic Decathlon. The Arndell team competed against 44 other schools from across the state in 10 academic disciplines to match wits with the best of the best. In fast and furious rounds the Arndell team proved themselves finishing 19th in the Creative Producers section, 17th in the Art and Poetry round and in an impressive start to the competition they came 1st in the engineering session. The challenge was to construct a free-standing structure that would keep a marble in motion for the longest period of time possible. It was a hands-down victory as the Arndell team displayed initiative, creativity and a sound knowledge of

design to blow the other teams out of the contest.

I would like to congratulate and thank all of the students who were a part of LEAP this semester. I hope your learning experience matched your positive approach and enthusiasm during the programs. Stay tuned for more upcoming LEAP events including the two teams of Arndell LEAP students competing in the national Tournament of Minds next term.
