# From The Headmaster: Dr. John Goddard

Have you noticed that the Advocate has more pages of "attachments" than not? Most of the essential information is in the **Newsflash**, handed out each week in paper form; and the Advocate, in an on-line form, giving you a chance to find out more details. Please use both – for both are really important in the weekly life of the School.

The Advocate itself can now move to a fortnightly basis: you can use it to extend on the Newsflash, or to download flyers, or to enter into further discussion on major issues.

One issue I want to raise with you – and it is there for you in the Parenting Tips attachment – is how we respond to aggression. The attached article talks about aggression from a number of points of view, and with respect to various age groups. Although it does not offer simplistic situations (there are none, to a complex problem!) it does emphasise how fair, loving and reasonable discipline, consistently applied, benefits all children, not only those with a tendency to physical and/or verbal aggression. Setting clear limits, getting acknowledgement of them and sticking to them really helps us all. It also helps when we can acknowledge **good behaviour** that falls within the set limits: that makes it easier and more telling when we chastise bad behaviour that falls outside them.








# **From the TAS Faculty:** Mrs Roshini David Paul, Accredited Practising Dietitian Member of the Dietitians Association of Australia

### Lipids (cont'd) (Term 3, Week 3)

What are the other functions of fat? Fats provide the cushion/protection for all vital body organs and are also responsible for providing insulation under the skin thereby protecting he body against cold temperatures. They also provide fat soluble vitamins A, D, E & K; impart flavor to food; provides a feeling of fullness as it delays the emptying time of food from the stomach (commonly called as the 'satiety value'). Fats supply EFA's (Essential Fatty Acids) which are necessary for growth and function. Fats can be used as an energy source which can then spare the use of protein for growth and repair.
