## From The Headmaster: Dr. John Goddard

### *In praise of Creativity:*

During this week, as Chair of the HICES (co-educational) group of schools in Sydney, I had the great pleasure, firstly, of attending a meeting of Heads at which the main discussion centred on promoting creativity in our schools, and secondly, of attending the annual HICES Music Concert. The concert was a marvel: groups of instrumentalists and singers, and a final massed group which must have had well over 300 taking part. It was an exhilarating evening, and the greatest joy, for me, was to see the looks of animation and excitement on the faces of the students as they explored what music could mean to them.

The discussion amongst Heads of Schools was also very interesting – in a slightly conforming way. Many participants wanted to affirm that lots of creative things (not just in Music, of course) were happening in their schools but that the systems imposed on us (especially the HSC system) actually stifles creativity. Now, I know that a slavish focus on learning set material is not the best way to educate, let alone to promote creativity; but, in a fortnight in which I have been aware of splendid final “products” in a wide range of HSC subjects, I am convinced that we can, and do, promote creativity within the system, as well as through our co-curricular programs.

What are some of the hallmarks of the kind of creativity we wish to encourage?

- a willingness to think outside the box, to take a fresh view,
- a willingness to fly a kite, just to see what happens,
- a willingness to make a mistake, to fail, but to try again,
- an understanding of working with others, so as to draw the best from them,
- a willingness to celebrate achievements, one's own and those of others.

I invite parents to talk to us about how we can encourage creativity on their children. We can do so without falling into that silly trap of “creativity vs. knowledge”. For Arndell we want both!

## *From the TAS Department: Roshini David Paul Accredited Practising Dietitian Member of the Dietitians Association of Australia*

### **Lipids (cont'd) (Term 3, Week 5)**

The presence and role of the various types of fatty acids is huge and often ignored. So let us try to focus on the fatty acids and see how they exist!

**Fatty Acids:** Fatty acids are classified as saturated and unsaturated.

#### **What are saturated fatty acids? (SFA's)**

These fatty acids do not have any double bonds between carbon atoms and hence are unable to combine with hydrogen. They are usually solid at room temperature. The common SFA's are palmitic, stearic, lauric and myristic acids.

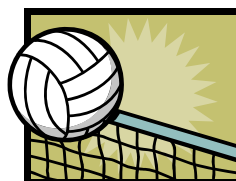
Palmitic – constitutes 25%-30% of fat depot of animals like sheep.

Stearic- present in beef tallow and lard.

Lauric and Myristic – present in vegetable oils such as coconut and palm oil.
