From The Headmaster: Dr. John Goddard

On Thursday of next week (September 25) we celebrate our annual Valedictory, our Farewell to Year 12. Of course, their HSC exams still lie before them: but next Thursday is a day of formal conclusion, a day to which countless students over the years have looked forward, the day on which formal schooling ends and they move on to a new stage. This year's senior cohort, accompanied by parents, will have time to reflect and to celebrate and this is as it should be, for there is much to celebrate in the achievements of the class of 2008.

As many of you will know, I was new to Arndell in 2003, the year in which our Year 12's hit Year 7. In those days Arndell had only the one Year 6 class, and so three quarters of Year 7, 2003 were just as new as I was. I vividly recall how I took an avid interest in that group, as a group I would be able to see right the way through their secondary schooling. And what an interesting, and sometimes challenging, group they have turned out to be!

Year 12, 2008, is a group full of energy, full of drive, full of enjoyment of life. They are a striking example of that simple truth that such drive and energy can lead in problematic directions as well as good ones. But the good directions have been wonderful indeed:

- you have seen some on the Year 12 display night of practical HSC projects,
- you have see some at bus lines each afternoon, when the service provided by many prefects, and especially by Kael Sharp, has been brilliant, the best I have seen in this kind anywhere,
- you have seen it in Year 12 sportspeople going on to higher representation, you have see it in the Captains and other prefects leading at assemblies, house and senior chapels, etc.

It is good to make such a list (it could go on and on) because to do so acknowledges the great good many in Year 12 have brought to this school, not only this year but over many years. To my mind, however, the most memorable occasions will be all those simple occasions for a friendly chat, or word of encouragement; or witnessing students going about their everyday work with dedication and engagement. I shall treasure many happy

memories, when a student has made a passing comment about my football side or has shared some new experience in their learning, or has commented on a thought provoking chapel service. It is these small interactions which so often demonstrate the maturity, and friendliness and the openness of the best of Year 12. When it is time to say good-bye (only in the formal sense, you understand), I shall be doing so with a great sense of gratitude to a lot of fine people who have contributed influentially to the development of Arndell: may many good things await you in the life beyond.

We wish farewell, at the end of this term to Mr Philip McKenzie (Science), who leaves us to take up a position in the publishing industry. We thank him for all that he has done and we look forward to staying in touch in terms of strategies to promote our school.
