### From The Acting Headmaster: Mr. James Webb



Now that was a really special week!

So many opportunities for the students to shine. So many staff members thoroughly involved in the life of the College. So much to tell.

Congratulations to past students for their selection in the top 100 (out of 3500) HSC Industrial Technology Projects to be placed in the Working with Timber exhibition at Fox Studios. In fact these students were chosen for their modelling in Graphics – Matthew Otten, Daniel Reid and James Mitchelhill-Miller. Added to this 48 out of 63 year 12 students have attained first round University places – many well underway with their courses – Arndell wishes them well.

Students Successes this week include young Joshua Muller (Year 3) in the Regional Little Athletics Championships making the final in both of his events - the U8 70m & 100m sprints, coming 5th in the 70m and 6th in the 100m, each in a field of 8 finalists. Well done! I am aware other students competed so congratulations to those as well. What about Bradley Halliwell Year 8 – now a Black Belt in Karate – what an awesome achievement and such hard work. Danica Barbagallo in the CIS Tennis Championships played at Pymble Ladies College 4<sup>th</sup> in her pool – congratulations on a fine performance. These are just a few of the successes that show what a willing and talented student body we have.

The College Bush Fire Appeal to support the work of the Sydney Diocese has come to an end with a stunning array of contributions. To thank each person would simply take the rest of the Advocate and I would be certain to miss someone. Students, Staff, Parents and Friends of the College have opened their hearts to the needs of others. A most sincere thank you for all that you have done to raise money for the bushfires – we are still counting and will confirm the total amount next week.

The Common Sparrow

Remember the smiley face that was talked about at the end of the year. Jupiter, Venus and the moon were so positioned that it looked like God was smiling down on the world. In the light of our econimic situation, the destructive nature of the bush fires and the floods, is God still smiling?

You only have to look at the life of Christ and know that God is NOT smiling at these times of devastations. Luke 12:6-7 Jesus said: "Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. Indeed,

the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."


