NAPLAN Testing for Years 7 and 9.

Parents of Years 7 and 9 students should be aware of the National Testing program that is being held for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students next week (Tuesday 12th, Wednesday 13th and Thursday 14th May.) These tests will take place for Years 7 and 9 in the Gymnasium during periods 1, 2 and part of p3 each of these days. Please note the following equipment requirements for these tests.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS for testing NAPLAN 2009

Students are to bring:

- A sharpened lead pencil (no pacers or pens allowed)
- A pencil sharpener
- An eraser
- Glasses if needed for reading
- Tissues or handkerchief if needed
- A novel to read (in case of early exam completion)
- A watch
- Recess and lunch as usual. (Canteen will be available)
- Books and equipment for periods 3-6 of Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday
- A working calculator for the first test in Numeracy- needed for Thursday only.

Students are not allowed to take into the NAPLAN room:

- Dictionaries
- Coloured pens or pencils
- Pacers or mechanical lead pencils
- Felt pens
- Highlighters
- Correction fluid, liquid paper, white out etc.
- Glue
- Blu tack or similar
- Mobile phones, ipods or other electronic storage devices

Students will be expected at school at the usual time and will go to their period 1 classroom for daily notices and roll marking until 8.45am. The testing will then proceed in the gym by 8.50am. If they are late to school (after 8.45am) they must go to the office first to get a late pass and then go straight to the gym.

Hi Everyone

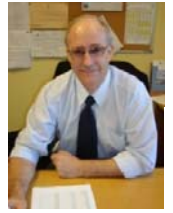

But I tell you, if you use the wrong glue for the wrong job it will not be as effective and will not last the distance. Similarly with family and community connection – use the wrong glue to bind them and the bond is superficial or short lasting.

I hope the families of Arndell enjoy the gift of the Colin and Nudge DVD as they watch it together. I have watched snippets of the Colin and Nudge DVD and a few weeks ago Nudge visited Arndell Community Church. The church meets in PA building each Sunday at 10.15 a.m.

I particularly hope it helps you to establish, or to renew a connection with God through the achievements of Christ. The Bible is full of advice and instructions concerning the need for connection, community and the wonder these bring for a substantial life. The whole purpose of Christ is to bring people to God – so they can connect with Him – and in that connection they connect with others in a way that establishes a whole new community. We call these new communities “church.”

We live in a fast pace world and sadly relationship breakdown exists in communities, families and between us and God the creator. He created families, communities and desires that remain strong and enrich the lives of many. I encourage the families of Arndell to attend church regularly, so that the families have time to reconnect with Christ and each other so that they can be strengthened by God. Do it and you will learn something important about family bonds and community connections better than anything else that is offered in this world.
