From The Acting Headmaster: Mr. James Webb

My section of the Advocate is, this week, a mixture of encouragement, frustration and concern.



I have been so **encouraged** by the involvement of the community in so many activities during the first half of the year. The Family Fun and Open day demonstrated strength of feeling that has been lacking of late. The comment from one family was 'The atmosphere

is excellent and there are so many happy faces – we need to build upon this'. My thanks to all who contributed, the organizers, parents, staff and students alike, in making this an outstanding success.

My frustration is the ongoing issue with uniform in both the Junior and Senior School. Time and time again we check students about their uniform, which is what our customers, you the parents, want. This does not help our image and certainly does little to raise the standards in the College. So my plea is that you demand of your children better standards and a greater sense of pride in both uniform and appearance.

Knit for Niger' The perfect winter activity!!

Johnson house is aiming to provide at least one knitted patchwork blanket to send to a hospital in Niger – north-east Africa.

The blanket will be given to a woman recovering from fistula surgery. Fistulas are injuries suffered by women – often young women – during childbirth. The injuries are often so severe that the women are usually banished from their homes and villages and left without social, physical and financial support.

With a surgical procedure and rehabilitation they are usually able to return to their homes and families to resume normal life.

Johnson house is looking to raise funds to assist with the support of women who aren't able to return home but also to provide a colourful blanket as a reminder that people on another continent know of their problems and care enough to help.

Please help us to help them by supporting our fundraising. If you are able to knit – or persuade a friend or family member to knit, please use the following dimensions to knit colourful squares. When finished, send them in to school so that when we have sufficient we can sew them together and send the blanket/s to Niger.

Please use 8 ply wool to knit squares 25 x 25 cm (10 x 10 inches). Donations of balls of 8 ply wool would also be appreciated.

I'm sure most of you know that though because there were so many of you there, it was great to see and a pleasure to be a part of it all. There was such a good community feel to the day as the whole school –


round and round come rain, hail or shine!
