From The Headmaster

On a cold afternoon at Galston High School our Intermediate Boys Rugby Team went down gallantly 34-5 against a well drilled and skilful Galston High School team. The score line itself

did not reflect the quality of the game played nor does it by its raw detail acknowledge the vast improvement our boys have made since their last outing three weeks ago. At the end of the game, which was played in really good spirit, our boys walked off the field disappointed that they had lost but satisfied in the knowledge they had actually improved in the key areas of the game.

For the vast majority of the game we were defensively strong and this was all the more important as we played one man short for the entire game (which also meant that we did not have the luxury of substitute players). Our mauling and rucking skills up front enabled us to play several phase options and our srummaging was once again very solid as we were able to maintain possession at key moments of the game. The backline started to man up in its defensive structures and they started to make significant gains in their attacking options. So though we lost, against a very good side, the boys were proud of themselves, as were their parents and coach, and they were proud of themselves because they had trained well, executed the game plan and most importantly played as a team.

The ability to work and operate in a team is a vital life skill. So many of us work in teams in our professional lives and the more that we work together the more we accomplish what we set out to achieve. Working in a team requires commitment, determination, empathy, humility, leadership, sacrifice and patience just to name a few key qualities. Quality education is about more than just literacy and numeracy skills, though these are clearly important, quality education must also be about empowering and teaching our students real life skills which they will need in their lives post school. Playing in a sporting team is so much more than just about a healthy lifestyle, playing in a team is about learning how to deal with people, how to lead them, how to work with them and how to achieve with them.

But teamwork is not just the province of sport, it is also central to many of the other co-curricula activities that we offer here at Arndell. At the moment there are almost fifty students involved in this term's production of Oliver Twist. Students are learning lines, dance routines, stage construction; they are learning what it is to put on a show! This is requiring them to give up their afternoons, lunch times and some weekends. This is requiring them to listen to each other, understand each other and work with each other. They are also learning to appreciate what their teachers are willing to do for them so that they can have this opportunity. For these fifty or so students their lives will be richer for being involved in this experience.

Here at Arndell we want all of our students to become involved in life outside of the classroom as there is so much for them to learn from being involved in the various activities which are on offer. I also want us as a community to support these activities by going to watch them play their games, or attend the drama and musical evenings. In light

of this I would like to remind our community that Oliver Twist is on next week on Friday 18th June and Saturday 19th June, tickets are still available and I would love to see both nights sell out. The staff and students have put a lot into this production so why not come along and see what they are achieving. You might be surprised how well they are doing.




