

# From The Headmaster

During 2010 the Junior School Literacy focus was on improving spelling results across the Junior School. At the beginning of the school year students were tested on the normed South Australian Spelling Test. This was done to provide a comparative tool as a Pre-THRASS test.

All classroom teachers as well as the Learning Support Staff participated in a 2 day training course in THRASS (Teaching Handwriting Reading and Spelling Skills) during June. This was followed by regular curriculum meetings to share information gleaned from visits and to plan future directions.

During Terms 3 and 4 all classrooms started using the THRASS approach in their classrooms. Experienced THRASS staff provided demonstration lessons to further extend this teaching tool in the classroom. Staff continued to gather at curriculum meetings and to share ideas for resources they had made, and to encourage one another.

During the year parent nights were held at the school with a THRASS trainer and our teachers to explain the approach and the language students would be using.

Students were again tested on the S.A Spelling test later in the year and significant gains were noted with students at all levels. Some children had improved by as much as 3 years. The teachers were unanimous in their support of the program and will continue to enthusiastically implement these strategies in their classrooms in the year ahead. We look forward to seeing continued improved results and excellence in all areas of Literacy.

#### **NAPLAN RESULTS**

The NAPLAN results for Year 3 and Year 5 have been released and Arndell has done very well. In Year 3 the majority of our children were above the state average in Writing and Reading and well above the state average in all aspects of Numeracy. Large improvements were made in Grammar and Punctuation.

In Year 5 the children were above the state average in Numeracy and Writing and well above state average in Grammar and Punctuation.

The percentage of children in the top bands has improved in Numeracy and areas of Literacy.

These results are very encouraging and demonstrate that our teaching and learning programmes have been effective in raising the standards of Literacy and Numeracy at Arndell including the implementation of THRASS here.
