

Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> May, Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> May and Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> May.

• Notices have been given to each student concerning the organization of the tests. Please ask your child for the note if they haven't given it to you already.

#### Half Yearly Examinations for Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11

- Timetables for the Half Yearly exams to be held during the week, 16th to 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2011, were given to all students this week. Any student who did not receive a timetable should see Mrs McGowen in Student Services to obtain their copy.
- Year 11 exams will be held in the Senior Library Centre (rooms H7 and H8). Year 11 students are not required to be at the College if they do not have an examination, but may use the Mezzanine in the Library if they wish to study at school. Year 11 exams continue all week. The students are not required at school on Friday afternoon when no exams are scheduled.
- Year 10 exams will be held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May inclusive, in the Gym. Students who have study lessons will need to bring material to study from during those sessions and will study at their desks in the Gym.
- Year 9 exams will be held on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 20<sup>th</sup> May inclusive, in the Gym. The French exam only will be held on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> May. Students who have study lessons will need to bring material to study from during those sessions and will study at their desks in the Gym.
- Year 8 exams will be held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> May, in the Gym. Students who have study lessons will need to bring material to study from during those sessions and will study at their desks in the Gym. Some subjects will hold their exams during class time and these will be notified to students separately.
- Year 7 exams will be held on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> May and Friday 20<sup>th</sup> May, in the Gym. Students who have study lessons will need to bring material to study from during those sessions and will study at their desks in the Gym. Some subjects will hold their exams during class time and these will be notified to students separately.
- Students who have **Special Provisions** will be given instructions on where to report and how these will be conducted this year, during the week prior to the exam period.
- If a **student is absent** for an examination, a Medical Certificate is required, as stated in the Assessment Policy Handbook issued to each student. If a student misses one or more examinations, they are asked to reschedule their examination(s) with Mrs Gillen as soon as they return to school.

#### Year 10 Subject Choices for Year 11 2012

We are currently starting the process for Subject selections for Year 11 in 2012. A form has been sent home with all students to ascertain preliminary intentions for schooling in 2012.

Parents should be aware of that all students are legally required to attend school until they are 17 years of age, unless they have an apprenticeship, are attending a TAFE course or are in full-time employment.

The first stage of our process is to gather information about subjects which our returning students wish to study in 2012 – 2013 for the Higher School Certificate. We have asked students to return their form by Friday, 13<sup>th</sup> May to Student Services.

Following this, we will determine the subjects which we will be able to offer our students in 2012, publish that list, conduct a **Parent** – **Student Information evening (Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May at 7.30 pm in the Auditorium)** and interview all students to allow returning students to make informed choices for their senior years of study.

### From the Head of Junior School: Rev. Keith Peterson

I'm sure that all of us probably had some response to last week's Royal Wedding. Given our particular British ancestry / experience it achieved a very high billing in the Peterson household on Friday evening. My daughter, whom I earlier had committed to bring home from School, was very concerned that I had been involved in a series of unscheduled meetings at School on Friday afternoon, meaning that we did not actually leave the College until late on Friday and flew through the Hawkesbury countryside at almost Superman rate so as not to miss the entrance of the first coterie of hats and any preliminary signs of wedding life around Westminster Abbey! Fortunately we made it home before



any wedding guests could early-bird it onto our screens; made it in time in fact for a special English Roast Dinner (including Yorkshire Puddings!) which my wife had so kindly prepared for us as part of a surprise celebration.

It may have been the genetic pull, but I found the whole occasion stubbornly heart-affecting and moving. I have been in Westminster Abbey many times — as a little boy with my grandparents; as a student on architectural mission etc, but I had never seen the Gothic, classical proportions of the abbey stand out in such a beauty — and the symbol of the living green trees, positioned down each aisle, just seemed to support that and add a wonderful completeness to the occasion.

We all watched enrapt throughout the telecast – joined in a little family community amidst the rainy hills of Kurrajong with our family across the world; with memory and tradition, wonderfully intertwining and impacting to become our new 'now'.

On reflection, it all made me think of the extended world which we seek to open for all of our children here at Arndell Anglican College Junior School. Together we live every day in the beautiful, classic reality of God's grace in Jesus – a grace given particular expression both in the life of our Anglican foundation and the marvellous now of the resurrected Jesus; King of Glory, King of Beauty whom we affirm as Lord of our College and seek to worship and to serve as Lord of our lives.

The ancient and the modern; tradition and the now; roots and foundations; the tree of life, personal faith and community history – these are surely precious foundations for us to treasure, teach and hand on to our children?



When I was speaking to the gentleman who collected the boxes, he told me that these schools were very much in need of children's story books and short novels in good condition to use as school readers.

### NSW Premier's Reading Challenge for Secondary Students: Mrs Connie Stephens (Head of Library Services)

As some of you may be aware, the Premier's Reading Challenge is a government supported reading incentive program for school aged children, from K-9. Whilst some of our Junior School students have participated in previous years the Secondary School students have not. This year all students in Yrs 7-9 received an invitation notice from me with details on what is required to complete this challenge. The main details are:

- 20 books must be read by the end of August, of which 15 must come from the PRC specified list.
- These lists can be found at the PRC site. The library also has a hard copy.
- The books have a variety of reading difficulty and include picture books and some graphic novels.
- The students register with the librarian to receive a PRC password, after which all books read can be logged in at the NSWPRC website by the student.
- Students who complete the 20 books must inform the librarian, who will verify completion of the Challenge.
- These students will receive a certificate signed by the NSW Premier, and have their names published in the SMH. Arndell students will also attend a special library luncheon.
- Most importantly, all students who attempt the challenge are endeavouring to improve their level of language literacy, which is commendable in itself.

We have around 55 students who have registered so far. Interested students, who have not registered, will need to do so soon to complete the Challenge in time.


