From the Head of Junior School: Rev. Keith Peterson

A reflection was once offered to me that, 'the most successful leader is as successful as the team around them'. I believe that this is true, and that the securest achievement occurs collegially. This is why such a big hope for myself, and the Junior School Staff, is that we will continue to develop together as a 'Community of Learners' so that we can really support one another in the application of best practice in teaching and learning within each and every classroom of Arndell Anglican College Junior School. This way we can greatly support the progress and achievement of



all of our children as each child takes their individual place as an equal and dynamic member of our whole Junior School 'Community of Learners'.

To get this happening, it's really important for all of us as the Junior School Staff to keep all professional eyes and ears open and to help one another to become aware of up-to-date educational research – because, like most things in 2011, our understanding of learning is always on the move! The best research comes with the most practical results. I do believe that we do need to grasp that kind of research and to think, "Now how might this work at Arndell?"

It's following just this path of thought that we have begun to introduce a model for supporting learning at Stage 3 in the Junior School. This model – involving the use of 'Show Me Boards' - comes from the research of Professor Dylan Williams. Professor Williams' contention is that just using the traditional method of 'hands up' in the classroom *sometimes just does not work* because, as he comments, 'only a quarter of students in most classrooms will choose to put their hands up. They can't wait to take part whilst others can just switch off'.

Instead, through active / pro-active use of 'Show Me Boards' teachers at Stage 3 can now gather a continually 'refreshed' idea of where there class' learning is actually at - by asking all students to respond directly to a question on their individual boards, or by using the boards in a variety of contexts to keep learning 'up to the minute' and live.

It is the working out of this approach which Mr Steven Catt describes below – putting all of this so importantly into our own Arndell College Junior School context. It is an approach which marks the start of a continuing journey – and exciting days ahead!

Stage 3 Learning Initiative: "Show Me" Boards: Mr Steven Catt Class Teacher Yr 5R

At the beginning of Term 2, all students in Stage 3 were issued with mini white-boards (known as Show Me Boards) to assist and enrich their learning. *These Show Me* boards have been packaged together in a plastic document wallet with a marker and cleaning cloth. It has been explained to the students that these boards are to stay on their desks at all times so they are easily accessible by any student who sits at that desk. This initiative will hopefully continue and include Stage 2 in the near future.

The Show Me Boards were introduced, as a learning concept, to the Junior School Staff by Rev. Peterson at the beginning of the school year and are an initiative that I have seen and used on numerous occasions whilst teaching in the UK. I warmly welcome their inclusion to Arndell Anglican College. They are a great teaching and learning tool and the students have shown a keen interest in using the boards as much as possible. They can be used in any lesson across all KLA's. The main occasions where they have been used are Mathematics, THRASS lessons, Circle Time and Literacy.

Mathematics: During these lessons, students are required to investigate and process information in a visual manner. *The Show Me Boards* enable students to practise equations, drawing of shapes and patterns as well as fractions etc. The teacher can demonstrate a concept for the students on the white-board and then this can be copied by the students on their own *Show Me Board*. The teacher can then ask for the students to hold up their boards, giving the teacher a quick assessment of who has or has not grasped the concept before they begin the set task (instead of finding out after the lesson when marking the students' books). Also, some students need to be able to practise the concept with larger numbers or shapes. This visual and spacial intelligence is important to consider when modelling a new mathematical concept.

Another positive aspect of these *Show Me Boards* is that it enables the students to make mistakes and take risks without having to re-do the set task. If a teacher notices that the student has made a mistake on their *Show Me Board*, they are able to

have the student clean their boards and try again; thus stopping the student from making repeated mistakes in the set task and having to start all over again.

THRASS & Literacy: Students at AAC participate in the THRASS spelling and phonetics program across all stages. *The Show Me Boards* allow students to create THRASS analogies, syllables and other activities based on the THRASS program. Again, teachers are able to quickly assess and evaluate which students are making progress or finding the concept difficult and then able to assist those in need. Students who have grasped the concept can then move on to completing a set task in their books, confident that they are on the right track.

Circle Time: Circle Time is an activity where students are able to share their concerns, opinions and ideas in a democratic arena. Students can use the *Show Me Boards* in this time to write down feelings or ideas to share with the other members. They can also use the boards as a means of recording information to use back at their desks.


