Several students and parents have enquired lately about our end of year second-hand textbook sale. This sale is always held on the last Saturday of November and the first Saturday of December, from 10:00am – 12:00pm on the C-block verandahs. This year the dates are 26/11 and 3/12.

On these mornings, students and/or parents may bring in their old (current) textbooks to sell, and buy second-hand texts for the following year. Books, in good condition, are usually sold at around half the new price. Students will receive their 2012 textbook lists before this date and all textbook list prices are available online at the Campion book s website (campion.com.au) to price the books for sale.


