Positive Behaviour Guidelines Brochure: July 2012

For any School to really flourish and thrive it is essential that certain support structures be clearly in place. Our defining aim in the Junior School is that all of our children should have the fullest individual and collective opportunity to 'aim high' and to grow and achieve to their fullest individual and community capacity.



We are passionate in this aim.

We are also convinced that for this aim to be achieved, it can't be a matter of random ambition. Rather, it must be an aim worked and lived out through partnership and clear communication.

For, in order for the Junior School to continue to develop as a secure, happy place within which all of its children can learn and can grow into their fullest selves, we surely all best need to be on the same page? And this also needs to be an open and shared page - for as the Bible pictures it, a triple coil of rope is so much stronger than a single coil, for 'a threefold coil is not quickly broken': Ecclesiastes 4.

It is our hope that we might particularly see this triple strand, (parents/children/teachers), plaited together, in terms of each and every school/home partnership. For it is this partnership which the Junior School's Positive Behaviour Guidelines are particularly set to support, in looking to provide a single reference point for us all, a key statement of values and an explicit guide as to process.

As such the Guidelines are an expression of our Christian Mission as a School and of our calling to community and to a daily mutuality of care and respect. They are an expression of the priority we do place on communication and partnership with parents. They also provide a framework towards the defining and implementation of a consistent and transparent level of practice.

Over Week 2, each Junior School Family will be provided with a copy of the Junior School Positive Behaviour Guidelines (2012) – either at the Parent Consultation Evenings or as later enveloped and placed in a student's School Diary.

At the end of the round robin stage of the HICES debating competition, many positives are evident from Arndell's re-entry into the competition this year. A wide cross section of students from Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 have gained memorable experiences and some valuable skills in terms of both public speaking and the ability to think on their feet that will stand them in good stead into the future.

An exciting and somewhat unexpected bonus in our first year re-entering HICES debating is that the "Middle"

(Year 7) team of Elly Hibberd, Isaac Elliot, Rosie Rodgers and Amelia Pinter has qualified for elimination final to decide the regional winner against Penrith Anglican College next Monday, 30th at Arndell, commencing at 12 noon. This is a significant achievement by these Year 7 students in their first year of HICES competition.



The finals run on different rules as all finals are one hour preparation (no prior knowledge of the topic), so this will be a new, testing experience for the Year 7 team. We do know it will have something to do with the Olympic Games; a nice small topic area. Should the team win, they proceed to a Sydney zone final (against Emmanuel School, Randwick).

I would like to once more commend the Year 10 team and in particular, Dannii de Keizer and Oliver Kelly on their determination and positive attitude. Winning debates is not what it is all about (adjudication can contain surprises in terms of results) and the improvement in the skills of these students throughout the competition rounds and the fine example they provided for the younger teams were most praiseworthy. I also wish to thank all those staff who have been so supportive of the debaters, especially when it came to hosting the round here with so many visiting schools.
