From the Headmaster: Mr Gareth Leechman

Last weekend I was able to spend time with over 200 other Anglican School Principals, Chaplains and School Council Members at the annual Anglican Schools Australia Network Conference held in Darling Harbour, Sydney. It was a wonderful time for us to reflect on what we are all collectively trying to do as Anglican Schools, under the theme of *Renewing Minds, Changing Lives*. What continues to encourage me, is that though each of our schools serves a different community within Australia (and in the broader world, as we had several international visitors attend the conference), we are all trying to achieve similar outcomes for the students under our care.



Firstly, we all seem to recognize that each child that attends our Anglican schools is special to us. We believe that regardless of their academic, cultural, emotional or physical ability they are a gift from God to our community, which requires us to educate and nurture them to become the people they have been created to be. This is wonderful privilege that requires us to take our role as Christian Educators seriously; a role that is a vocation rather than merely as a job.

Secondly, we all believed that we should be striving for excellence within the various educational settings that our schools exist. For some that will be academic excellence, others will be pursuing cultural excellence, whilst others will possess a strong emotional or pastoral position as they strive to encourage their students to strive for excellence. For some it will be the pursuit of physical excellence that will be their dominant point of difference. The reality is that for many of our schools the pursuit of excellence in all four of these areas is what drives us, as we serve the communities under our care, and I would suggest this is what we are striving for here at Arndell Anglican College. These ideas can be clearly found in the College's Ethos and Values statement we published last year.

Finally, I think all of the Anglican Schools at the conference were all striving to challenge the students under their care to think about, and engage with, the Christian Faith. It was this Faith basis that many of us saw as being the significant point of difference from other more secular educational institutions who also offer a strong 'liberal' based educational experience. Our students' ability to engage with a logical and robust discussion about the Christian Faith provides them with an opportunity to explore a world view which connects them to their Creator, and gives them the opportunity to fully appreciate the world in which we live.

An Anglican education therefore, to me, is about appreciating each child individually, seeing each child under our care flourish and become the people they were created to be, and about giving them a strong faith basis from which they can build the rest of their lives. I know I came away from the conference having my mind reinvigorated and with a renewed desire to change the lives of our students here at Arndell Anglican College.

Week 5 at the Junior School will be a very full one indeed!

Firstly, Week 5 is Science Week! This year the Junior School began to implement a new, hands-on, investigative and interactive Science Program, 'Primary Connections'. Developed in partnership between the Australian Academy of Science and the Australian Government Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations, 'Primary Connections' focuses on developing students' knowledge understanding and skills in both science and literacy. And it does so in a way that is



open-ended and evidence based – with students creating hypothesis, calculating variables and explaining conclusions in the real way of all real scientists. 'Primary Connections' is about learning the processes of Science by actually doing and experiencing science. It is delivered across the Junior School to a teaching and learning style that is both live and lively!

We will be setting 'Primary Connections' at the centre of our approach to, and celebration of, Science Week 2012. Our classrooms will be full of group investigations, experiments, discussion and analysis. There is a warm and open invitation to all parents to join in by attending our Primary Connections Information Evening on Wednesday 15th August at 6:30 – 8:00pm in the Junior School Library. This will be a time to learn more about the course – but also in the true investigative spirit of its approach, to have a go at exploring its hands-on approach as we try some inter-active scientific work-shopping together. It'll be an Information Evening with an open and enthusiastic smile! Please do come and join us if you are able.

And of course, Week 5 concludes with the Junior School's annual Grandparents and Special Friends' Day. Here again, many of our Open Classrooms will be focusing on Science. A Junior School Science Display will also be available for view in the Junior School Library.

Grandparents and Special Friends' Day is always a great occasion at Arndell Anglican College Junior School. But really, how could it not be when it celebrates such very special people with a unique place in the hearts of so many of our children?

Do Grandparents Rule OK? Probably! And certainly we hope they will on this, their special day, at Arndell Anglican College Junior School!

On Thursday the 26 July Arndell hosted its first annual art show with great success, showcasing the artwork of students in Visual Arts from years 7 -12. The show exhibited a fantastic range of diverse mediums, representing the hard work that the Visual Arts students undergo at Arndell.

The Year 7 and 8 works displayed a wonderful mastery of the ceramic medium. After their study of the life and work of Picasso, Year 7 showcased their understanding of Cubism through their bright and intriguing ceramic masks. Year 8 represented their exploration of nature in the production of a functional clay oil burner.

The elective art students in Years 9 and 10 showcased the wide range of mediums and concepts they have studied in their developing artistic practice. 

Book Week is coming to Arndell Anglican College Junior School!


To celebrate Book Week the Junior School will be holding a Book Character Parade.


Each child is invited to come to school dressed as their favourite book character.

A special morning assembly will be held for parents and students at 8:45am on the Junior School basketball court.




