I would like to announce to the college the appointment of Mr Martin Conway as our first Deputy Head of Junior School. Martin has spent the last eleven years at The King's Preparatory School at Parramatta where he has taught Stage 2 and 3 classes as well as serving as a Stage Coordinator and Head of House. Martin has also been an important driver behind the implementation of the PYP program at The King's Preparatory School as well as being an active participant in the school's sporting program. Prior to his time at The King's School Martin was a teacher at Trinity Grammar School at Strathfield. Martin

Then on Thursday we had all of our Infants classes involved in the Hawkesbury Eisteddfod and this resulted in a first placing for the Kindergarten class and a second placing for Year 1. It is a great educational experience for our students to be involved in and one that will build their confidence greatly. Well done to the Infants team on this worthwhile initiative.

Finally the week finished with Shakespearience – a montage of pieces from Shakespeare. The night started off with some Shakespearean Sonnets, followed by a soliloquy from Romeo and Juliet and a scene from the comedy A Midsummer Night's Dream. These performances were produced by students from Year 7 right through to Year 9 and all students performed really well. The night was capped off with a parody of Shakespeare tragedy Macbeth called Mmmbeth by the Year 9 drama class. FROM THE HEAD OF JUNIOR SCHOOL: Rev. Keith Peterson

After School Procedures

At Arndell Anglican College Junior School we are always looking to carefully monitor our Health and Safety procedures. Recently we have made particular focus on procedures re: the safe departure of children from Junior School Classrooms at the end of each school day.



The safety of our children is of paramount importance to us, and, of course, of total importance to you as parents/ guardians.

It is, therefore, in this sense of vital partnership, that I offer the following clarification and confirmation of the Junior School's *after school procedures.*

- At the completion of the Arndell Anglican College Junior School day at 3:05pm, all students should be collected from their classrooms by their nominated parent/guardian.
- It is the present policy of the Junior School that any remaining students might stay under the supervision of Junior School Staff until 3:30pm. Students will be supervised in an allocated Grade Classroom or in the Stage Central Area.
- After 3:30pm all still remaining students will be escorted by the member of staff on extended duty to the Camp Australia After School Care Facility, where their continuing supervision and safety might be guaranteed.
- At 3:05pm children should be collected from their classrooms by their parents / guardians or a sibling from Arndell Anglican College High School. It is not appropriate for a Junior School sibling to be given responsibility for supervision.
- No student is to be expected to go to another Junior School Classroom unsupervised and on their own, at or after, 3:05pm
- If a person, other than the person/guardian already nominated, is due to pick up a student at 3:05pm then previous notification should be given to the student's Class Teacher of this change in arrangements. This notification might be placed in the Student's School Diary or communicated directly to the Class Teacher at an earlier opportunity.
- No Junior School Student is to leave their classroom at 3:05pm and wait, unsupervised, at the College Entrance Roundabout.

As previously indicated, your continuing help and partnership in support of this advice – and of the safety and welfare of all our children - is certainly very much appreciated.






From the Head of History & Biblical Studies: Dr Samuel Jackson

A Brief Note to Parents re: Bibles

Over the course of this term I have realized that some students are being told from home that they are not to mark their Bibles in any way. While I certainly don't want to discourage a healthy respect for God's Word this is causing some problems for these children. In Biblical Studies lessons students are encouraged to underline key ideas, jot down marginal notes and write in crossreferences which help them to respect God's Word by understanding it more deeply. To give an example, to the right is a page from my own Bible with the sorts of markings I make to help me get the most out of reading it. If you are still uncomfortable with this please feel free to contact me but hopefully this allays some of the concerns you may have had. God encourages us to delve into his Word often and in depth (Deuteronomy 6:5-8) as it is useful for salvation (Romans 1:16), teaching and equipping us for obedience to Him (2 Timothy 3:15-17). Asking students to mark their Bibles is part of our attempt to put this into action.
