Wiburd Shield Cricket report 2013: Mr Tom Lavelle

Arndell Anglican College had a talented team this year and had the potential to do very well. It was therefore a little disappointing for the lads to go out in the second round against Oakhill College after beating Hills Grammar so comprehensively in the first round. Had the fixture been played as a home fixture on astro turf, it may have been a different story but to succeed within this competition and more importantly, as individual cricketers in the long term, a familiarity with how to cope with varying conditions playing on turf is crucial.

Oakville were simply too good on the day under their home conditions; they

knew their pitch and ground very well, won the toss and exploited the conditions to the maximum. The Arndell batsman were subjected to unrelenting pressure and "war of attrition" tactics in terms of scoring and this was a new experience for many young Arndell players used to hitting their way out of trouble on synthetic surfaces.

Batting first, Oakhill posted 152 runs (38 overs) "on the board" based mainly on a fine opening partnership. Indeed, at 0 wicket for 70 (16 overs), Oakhill looked in command but a spirited Arndell fightback saw Oakhill all out for only 152 on a good batting pitch and small ground. Nathaniel Goldrick 2-12, Jack Kenyon 2-13, Daniel Jones 2-28, Joel Brennan 2-24, Declan Horne 1-13 and Jake Hilder 1-29 were the wicket takers whilst Will Cullen was arguably the best bowler despite taking no wickets (0-12 from 8 overs).

Oakhill then really applied the pressure with a lot of talking, both from the players on the field and from the rotating classes of boys who came to watch.

There was a noisy semi-circle around the field for most of the day. The loss of our captain (Number 3 bat and opening bowler) Harry Ridgewell to a serious back injury from outside cricket before leaving the College didn't help the cause nor did the dismissal of opener Nathaniel Goldrick from what appeared to some to be a "bump ball". This meant that when Jake Hilder was unluckily run out for 15, Arndell were suddenly at trouble at 3 for 36. Despite a cameo top score of 18 not out from Will Cullen (batting number 6) and spirited resistance from Daniel Jones for a long time, no other Arndell batsman managed double figures and we were eventually all out for 69 (25 overs).

In the first round, Hills Grammar won the toss and elected to bat at Colbee Park. Hills Grammar were all out for 62 after 16 overs, with sundries the second top score with 16 and only the opening batsman reaching double figures. Excellent catching (7 catches) and fielding (1 run out and some close calls) with Jake Hilder (3 for 8), Harry Ridgewell (2 for 6), Will Cullen (2-16), Daniel Jones (1 for 12) and Joel Brennan (1 for 12) the wicket takers.

In reply, Arndell knocked off the 63 required in 6 overs for the loss of Nathaniel Goldrick (11) with Jake Hilder (34 not out), Harry Ridgewell (24 not out) the run scorers. It was a thoroughly impressive display!

A huge thank you to all those staff and parents who supported the team and to Mrs. Horne in particular, for her excellent scoring and the time and effort she so freely gave.

NSW Government Transport – School Student Transport Scheme
