### From the Deputy's Desk: Mr James Webb

A most warm welcome to 2013!!

Your children certainly have hit the ground running and we, in the High School, are delighted with the manner in which they have commenced the year.

Parents it is so important that you are familiar with procedures and expectations. A great deal of information can be found in the College Diary or in pamphlets and booklets that will come home, from time to time, with your child.

I would like to draw your attention to a few matters:

**Firstly punctuality**; it is crucial that we get the day underway on time. We are governed by buses as this is the main form of transport for students across the College. However there are a number of students brought in by parents. If you are one of these please, please have your child here on time.

The next, often contentious matter is **uniform**. Please follow the rules laid out in the College Diary especially length of dresses, make-up and jewelry. I know this can be a battle but firm guidelines and support from home make our job as teachers that much easier and we can get on with the business of teaching.

**Discipline** matters come up from time to time and thankfully over the past few years these aspects of welfare are becoming less and less. However it is crucial that you are aware of the procedures and our goal which is always to seek resolution and to move on.

Every child is valued at Arndell and it is our hope that each one flourishes under our guidance. Problems in class can, generally, be resolved and students get on with the business at hand. However matters may arise where a student does not co-operate, behaviour is unruly, work is not completed or a student disrupts the learning of others. Intervention at this point is crucial. Generally a subject detention is issued and the problem is solved. Where the problem is not solved you may receive a call from the Head of House. This gives you the 'Heads Up' and you can assist us with resolving the matter.

Should we not be in a position to solve the problem severe sanctions and monitoring may need to take place. Afterschool or Saturday Detentions or Suspensions combined with ongoing monitoring and parent interviews will take place.

You can see from this overview that every effort is made to create resolution and it is crucial that we solve matters as early as possible. We will not tolerate the learning of others being interrupted by unacceptable behaviour.

I intend to, over this term, send out information booklets that will assist you. Please contact me if you would like a chat or if something is concerning you.

Education is a three way partnership between home, school and the student. If we are all on the same page it prevents misunderstanding and miscommunication.

Along with the senior staff, I look forward to working with you and your child in 2013.

### Curriculum - What's On!

#### Year 11 and 12 Study Skills

Year 1 1and 12 will be participating in a Study Skills day on Thursday 7 February (Year 11) and Friday 8 February (Year 12) at school. The purpose of the Study Skills Day is to instill confidence in students as to how and why we study to prepare for examinations.

The day is being held in the Auditorium and will include the following topic areas:

- Goal Setting
- Creating a Working Environment
- Active Studying Skills
- Essay Writing
- Studying for Mathematics
- Preparing for Examination Blocks
- Managing Stress

Arndell Staff will be leading the sessions and students will be actively participating in activities throughout the day.

Students are required to bring with them writing materials and their laptops.

#### **Maths and Science Club**

The Maths and Science Departments offer afterschool clubs which are open to all students in years 7 – 12 who wish to have additional assistance with maths and science. These classes run on the following afternoons:

Maths Club: Tuesday and Thursday afternoons in room B2 on Tuesday and Thursday 3:10pm to 4:30pm.

Science Club: Wednesday 3.15 – 4.14. Room TBA.

### From the Science Faculty: Mrs Elmarie Filmalter

This term the Science faculty is off to a flying start with a very busy term ahead. We have in the next six weeks four excursions taking place. This includes Preliminary Biology and Preliminary Science to Bantry Bay on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March, Year 10 having a visit from the CSIRO for a forensic science workshop on the 18<sup>th</sup> of March, Year 9 to Collaroy rock platform on the 8<sup>th</sup> of February and Year 7 to Taronga Zoo on the 8<sup>th</sup> of March. As well as this Year 8 will be going on a 'skylab' excursion in term, details to be confirmed.

There is also the 'Space to Grow' program beginning next week for Year 11 Physics Students and Year 10 students considering taking Physics. This is aimed at helping students gain greater knowledge and skills in Physics leading to improved outcomes. This program relates directly to the Year 11 topic of 'The Cosmic Engine' and the Year 12 topic of Astrophysics which comprises 25% of the Preliminary and HSC Physics course. It will run from 3:15pm to 4:30pm Wednesday afternoons each week.

The Science faculty will also run the Science homework class on Wednesday afternoons from 3.15-4.15pm. All students are welcome!

Dear Parents / Guardians

This is to kindly inform you of a revision of the delivery and structure of PE/Sport in Arndell Anglican College Junior School for 2013.

From the start of Term 1, all Junior School students will participate in specialised skill based PE lessons taken by Mrs Rosemary Cornick, who is taking on the key role of Subject Leader and specialist teacher of PE and Sport across the Junior School. This is a very important and exciting role and initiative which will allow us to explicitly support the development of an age-specific range of physical skills to the benefit of each student and age cohort in the Junior School.

The PE lesson will occur weekly for all classes on a time-tabled basis. In addition to weekly PE lessons students will also participate in a weekly Sport session. Sport will be run to a Year, Class or Stage format and will be taken by Mrs Cornick and/or the Class Teachers. Sport will support the PE Program as referenced to BOS Curriculum Outcomes Skills.

Whilst most Sport sessions will be organised in line with the Wednesday timetabled Sport, timetabling constraints will necessitate some adjustments *(please see chart below for details for all Stages and Classes).* 

Year 5 and Year 6 students will participate in the HZSA Primary Inter School Sport Competition on Wednesday afternoon in Term 2 and Term 3 respectively.

An outline of the PE/Sport Program - Prep to Year 6 - will also be available on the College Webpage once finalised.

In view of the introduction of weekly specialist PE lessons, with their extended range of activities and opportunities, there will be certain requirements and these are outlined below:

**PE Uniform** will be worn on PE lesson and Sport/Fitness days (please see the chart below). The PE uniform can be purchased from the Uniform shop and consists of:

- College navy blue shorts and College PE shirt, with white socks
- Please be advised that students should not wear "fashion" sport or slip on shoes, as these offer little protection and support for growing feet and joints.
- The College Hat is COMPULSORY and sunscreen 30+ 4/6 hour\_should best be applied the morning prior to coming to school.
- A drink bottle filled <u>with water</u>. Please do be aware that juice and cordial do not offer adequate hydration, Sport Drinks (Gartorade, Powerade, etc) are only best consumed during high intensity training and competition and soft drinks dehydrate.

We do certainly hope that your child will enjoy the many new opportunities offered by this addition to the educational program at Arndell Junior School!

#### **Representative Sport:**

Junior School House Carnivals will be organised over 2013 in Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics. These carnivals are compulsory for all students in Year 3 -6. Students in Year 2 who are already participating in club training, or who excel in one or all of the relevant disciplines and who are turning 8 years old in 2013, are invited to attend. These Carnivals are House based and used to select our College Primary team to compete at the HICES Representative Carnivals. Additional Primary HICES Representative Sport information for Year 5 & 6 will be posted and is available from Mrs Cornick. Please also note that all Sport dates are posted on the Primary Sport Notice Board. The Board is situated between the Year 5 classrooms. All information will also be accessible via the College Webpage shortly.
